# Church Window Refurbishing Capital Fund Drive Update

April 30, 2017

Our \$109,000 goal was achieved because of *your* generous donations. Six contributions of \$10,000 each were received. Plaques are being prepared to recognize this level of contribution. The following families made this level of contribution: James Effertz, Bernard Shambour Jr., Patricia Quinn, Leon Wickenhauser, Adrian Wickenhauser and Dale Wildung. In addition to these plaques, we have recognized the donation to this project from the Sister Christa fund, established by Catholic United Financial, on the window in the sanctuary.

The second phase of the Stained Glass refurbishing, which includes the 6 south windows in the church and the windows in the Adoration chapel, is scheduled to start the first part of May with completion scheduled in August 2017.

The Church Air Conditioning is scheduled to be started soon with completion before the summer cooling season. Church air conditioning was included in this project because ventilation windows were eliminated as part of the stained glass refurbishing.

The capital fund drive also included a reduction of the principal of the church roof replacement loan of \$10,000. This payment has been made. \$23,000 still remains on this loan. The Archdiocese has offered to forgive the assessment fee for loan principal payments made before June 30, 2017. Please consider a FIF contribution which will help us retire the church roof loan. Mark your contribution envelope "roof loan".

There is still time to increase your contribution for this fund to qualify for a plaque to recognize gifts of \$10,000 or more. Roof loan contributions will count toward your total gift amount.

The Stained Glass window restoration included the generous donation of time and talent for parts of the project: installation of new exterior limestone window sills, lowering of the interior window sills, insulating and providing support for plaster around the windows, and painting of the wall around the new windows. With out these donations of time and talent the window cost would have increased.

# Parish Pastoral Council Meeting Minutes - March 8, 2017

Meeting was opened with prayer at 6:15pm. Attendance: Fr. Gregory, Sherry Witte, Doris Mielke, Herb Reiling, Ralph Laumann, Andy Kleindl, Laura Templin, Julie Clemensen.

We had a brief discussion about the possible need for a security camera. Some boys have been milling around the church. (Approximately 10 years old.) The Buildings and Grounds committee is looking into this.

Windows Project – Phase 1 is pretty much complete. Starting phase2 – we have the proxy back from the archdiocese.

Monica Kooiman came to give an update on the Ladies Guild and Fish Frys. The Ladies Guild is still handling funerals and they put together the schedules for cleaning the narthex and the church. They're trying out a Roomba vacuum. They also purchase the cleaning supplies, etc. Looking at getting wireless internet at the church and for use with the Roomba. Fish fry profits are to be used for youth and adult faith formation, which would include catholic school scholarships and possibly paying down some on the roof loan. Looking at cleaning out the back of the cafeteria to make more room for seating.

Guardian Angels Spring Fling and St. Joe's Boogie Blast are on April 22<sup>nd</sup>. They are welcome to hang fliers and put announcements in the bulletin.

Liturgy/Worship Books are being discussed by the Joint Leadership committee. Would like to use the same book at both parish.

Divine Renovation discussion – Chapter 5 (Uplifting Music and Homilies).

We discussed the 3 H's – Hospitality, Hymns and Homilies at great length. Talked about involving children in the homily. Some parishes have a children's homily, some have them come forward and sit in front of the priest. We talked about possibly asking the children a few questions at the beginning of the homily if there are several children in attendance. Fr. Gregory will give this some more thought.

For our next meeting, we'll read Chapter 5 pages 136 – 153: Meaningful Community.

Reviewed and approved of the minutes from our 2/1/17 meeting.

Pancake breakfast – no updates as of yet.

8am St. Bernard Easter Mass – Fr. Gregory is looking for a sub. If we can't find someone, we won't have an 8am mass and would probably need to set up some chairs in the narthex because Easter mass is well-attended.

The Joint Leadership Committee wants to work together in the ministries. Looking at the possibility of having a joint parish council. Would like to have one, joint mission/vision statement.

Our parish council is planning to provide guidance to the stewardship committee in May. Discussed meeting with each committee on separate occasions.

Easter Egg Hunt – The council is in favor of having an Easter Egg Hunt but Fr. Gregory recommends having it on Easter Saturday, which is April 22<sup>nd</sup>. It's liturgically more appropriate than having it during Holy week.

Lent Stations of the Cross - the music is beautiful and it's going well. We should invite people to come.

Office Updates – Sherry has some meetings and seminars coming up. There is an ad in the paper for a shared bookkeeper. Received 3 resumes so far. Roger Storms talked to Sherry about maybe doing something at the chili feed in regards to finishing the window project and celebrating the 140<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the church building. We can talk about this at our May meeting.

Our April meeting will be held on Tuesday, April 11<sup>th</sup> at 7:15pm and our May meeting will be held on Tuesday, May 23<sup>rd</sup> at 7:15pm. (Roger Storms will attend this meeting on behalf of the Stewardship Committee).
