Hunter was eating very little and getting him to finish a to feed for the doctor and she noted that his color was not good and he was pretty lethargic. She told Brooke that Hunter should be taken to delays, hypotonia, etc. Hunter's particular heart defect includes a large ventricular septal defect which is a hole in the heart and early stages has undergone one heart surgery already and will have another one likely before his first birthday. He will forever be a heart kid and this will the ER at Children's Hospital. Fast forward three months. Hunter started his journey in the NICU but after two weeks was transferred to the bottle was a fight. Mom and Dad became very concerned and made an appointment with the doctor. During the clinic visit, Hunter refused of cardiomyopathy. He also has a heart arrhythmia that without the appropriate medication his heart does not tolerate the arrhythmia. He Cardiac ICU. Through much testing and weeks of the unknown, Hunter was diagnosed with a rare genetic chromosome deletion syndrome, Hunter is the son of Brooke & Tim Schmitz; grandson of Ascension parishioners Jean & Denis Schmitz. 
