

The Most Holy Trinity Sunday May 30, 2021

The Most Holy Trinity

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

There is an old and much-repeated story about St. Augustine, one of the intellectual giants of the Church. Once, he was walking on the seashore meditating on the mystery of the Trinity. There, he observed a little boy carrying water in the palm of his tiny hands and pouring it in a nearby pool. St. Augustine asked the little boy what he was trying to do. The child replied, “I want to pour out the whole water of the sea into the pool.” The saint exclaimed, “You will never succeed in that.” Then the child stood up and said, “I do exactly as you do. Do you think, with your small understanding you will be able to discover the mystery of the Trinity?” Then the child disappeared.

The mystery of the most Holy Trinity is a basic doctrine of faith in Christianity. It is understandable not with our heads, but with our hearts. It teaches us that there are three distinct persons in one God, sharing the same divine nature. We believe in this mystery because Jesus who is God taught it clearly, the Evangelists recorded it, the Fathers of the Church tried to explain it and the Councils of Nicaea and Constantinople defined it as a dogma of Christian faith.

Even though Jesus did not use the word Trinity, he, however, was familiar with the very word that comprises the Trinity, namely, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. When he taught his disciples how to pray, his model prayer begins, “Our Father...” When he was baptized, he heard the voice, “You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased; and the Holy Spirit appears as a dove.” After his resurrection, he appeared to his disciples, breathed on them and said, “Receive the Holy Spirit.” Today’s gospel (Matthew 28: 16-20) describes Jesus’ final appearance to his apostles just before his ascension into heaven. At that moment, he commissioned them to make disciples of all nations, and commanded them to baptize those who came to believe, “in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.” Rather than tells us what the Trinity IS, Jesus chose to tell us what the Trinity DOES, for us.

On this Solemnity of the most Holy Trinity, we are not so much concerned about the mystery of God being one but three persons, nor about the doctrine of this mystery. What we are actually celebrating is God’s dynamic and intimate friendship with us through the three persons of the Trinity. The doctrine of the Trinity is ultimately not about the abstract nature of God, nor about God in isolation from everything. It is rather a teaching about God’s life with us, and our life with each other. When Jesus told us how to pray to our Father, he told us to ask our Father to give us our daily bread, forgive us our trespasses as we forgive others, and lead us not into temptations. There is nothing mysterious, nothing out of this world about these requests. When Jesus is identified as God’s own beloved Son, his Sonship does not hold the splendor of heaven, but rather the caring for the needs of his brothers and sisters on earth by giving his own body and blood.

On Pentecost, Jesus sent the Holy Spirit who promptly filled the hearts of disciples, so they could continue the work he had begun during his ministry. This is the God, the Trinity, who is for us. The doctrine of the Trinity affirms that it is God’s very nature to be committed to humanity, and that God’s face is turned toward us in love. The joy that this feast gives us today is that the God we worship here is the God who is for us and with us forever. Let us pray for the firm conviction that the Trinitarian God abides in us and that He is the source of our hope, courage and strength, and is our final destination. Let us practice the Trinitarian relationship of love and unity in the family relationships of father, mother and children because by baptism we become children of God and members of God’s Trinitarian family.

**Year 3 (2021-2022):
 The Church Engages**

Fall 2021: Parish Consultation Process with Small Groups

- Small groups meet in every parish to learn, pray, and discuss the focus areas.
- Parish feedback on priorities within each focus area will help inform the Deanery consultation.

**January/February 2022
 Deanery Consultation Process**

- Pastors and parish representatives gather one Saturday to learn, pray, and discuss the focus areas.
- Deanery feedback will help determine the Synod topics.

June 2022: Archdiocesan Synod Assembly (Pentecost Weekend):

- Approximately 500 appointed delegates (including two from each parish) gather to learn, pray, and discuss the Synod topics and recommend pastoral priorities to Archbishop Hebda.
- After considering the Synod recommendations, Archbishop writes a Pastoral Letter (November - Feast of Christ the King) leading to a Pastoral Plan to move our Archdiocese into the future.

Welcome Back!! As of today, you will be seeing some changes when you enter our worship spaces. The ropes will be removed and you can go back to your 'regular' pews. Masks will not be required but we strongly encourage those who have not been vaccinated (or anyone who wants to) to still wear masks. 


