



Corpus Christi: Our Spiritual Food

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The feast of Corpus Christi, the Body and Blood of Christ, is the very center and heart of the Church and of our faith. Although we celebrate the institution of the Holy Eucharist on Holy Thursday, the Church wants to emphasize its importance by a special feast. It was Pope Urban IV who extended the feast to the universal Church.

Our belief in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist derives from the promise of Christ to give his Body and Blood as our spiritual food and drink. It is found in the Gospels. Eucharistic theologians explain the real presence by a process called transubstantiation: the entire "substance" of bread and wine is changed into the glorified Body and Blood of Christ, retaining only the accidents, "taste, color, shape etc." of bread and wine. Vatican II states as a sacrifice, "the holy Eucharist is the center and culmination of Christian life."

A few years ago, a gentleman came to me to tell me that he was leaving the Catholic Church. He had made that decision two years earlier, but had put off changing his faith. I asked him, "Why"? He returned with the question, "Why am I leaving the faith or why did I wait two years to do so?" I responded, "Both." He said that he was leaving the faith because he found a religion where, to use the language of the day, he felt he was being fed. Then he said, "During the last two years, I couldn't convince myself to leave the Eucharist." He said that the new faith did have communion celebrations, but they were meals of fellowship, not the reception of the Body and Blood of Christ.

Some Catholics may not like the kind of songs sung in the Church, some others can not enjoy the homily, and still others may not like the priest and so on. I respect their decision, and I know that various experiences appeal to various people, but nothing could ever replace the Eucharist. We often focus on the enhancements to our celebration of Mass and forget why we celebrate Mass, and what the meaning of the Mass is. We celebrate Mass to be united with Jesus Christ at the Last Supper, and on Calvary at the Crucifixion of the Lord. We celebrate Mass to be united with Jesus Christ in the Eucharistic Gift of His Body and Blood. Most of the liturgical enhancements to our celebrations are wonderful, but none of them surpass the wonder of Jesus Christ, present in every Eucharist.

The celebration of the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ is an opportunity for us to focus on the Mass and the Eucharist. The act of receiving Holy Communion is meant to foster the abiding presence of the Lord in our soul and in our heart. The Eucharist is the Lord's dying gift to us. We receive His Body, His Blood, His humanity and Divinity. We celebrate the Living Memory of Jesus Christ. We speak to Him within ourselves. And He speaks to us, calling us to unite our pains to His Cross, strengthening us with the Living Food for the Journey of our Lives.

The Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ invites us to renew and deepen our faith in the Eucharist. When our faith in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist is strong, then our desire to participate in Mass and to receive Communion often is strong. Eucharistic devotions are meant to deepen our love for Christ really and truly present in the Eucharist. A deeper love for Christ in the Eucharist always leads to a deeper love for our family and our neighbor. Holy Communion and Eucharistic adoration strengthen our unity, mutual love, and spiritual and physical health. Let us receive Holy Communion with fervent devotion, love and respect.

2. Forming missionary disciples who know Jesus's love and respond to his call

3. Forming youth and young adults in and for a Church that is always young



