



Maintain a Positive Attitude to Rejection

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Bishop Fulton Sheen, the great preacher, was told by his college debate coach, “You are absolutely the worst speaker I ever heard.” Ernest Hemingway, the great novelist, was told by his teacher, “Forget about writing: you don’t have enough talent for it.” Richard Hooker, the author of MASH, had his book rejected by six publishers before it was finally accepted and became a best seller. These three were rejected early in life as useless for the future.

These stories are the modern example of the kind of rejection Jesus encountered when he returned to his home in Nazareth. (Mark 6:1-6a). Jesus has come home after doing some amazing things, healing, calming the storm, casting out demons, even raising a little girl to life. However, lack of faith prevents the people from believing Jesus as the Messiah. The people said to one another, “Is he not the carpenter, the son of Mary.” And yet Jesus demonstrated God’s strength in the very midst of denial and rejection unto Calvary.

St. Paul was pained when he heard the unjust attacks of his opponents. In addition, he had to carry all his life, “a thorn in his flesh” (2 Cor. 12:7). But he asserted that “when I am weak, then I am strong.” A thorn in the flesh could be a physical illness. It could take the form of rejection by others. Jesus said, “No disciple is greater than his teacher, no slave is greater than his master” (Mt 10:24). In other words, if people rejected Jesus in his lifetime, we shouldn’t be surprised if people reject us, when we stand for his teachings and values, in our lifetime.

We shouldn’t be surprised if people reject us because we oppose destroying innocent life through abortion. We shouldn’t be surprised if people reject us because we speak out in defense of human rights and justice. And finally, we shouldn’t even be surprised if some times our own families reject us. Jesus said this would happen (Lk.12: 53) if anyone loves Jesus and his values more than anything in this world.

When rejection occurs, it’s easy for the rejected one to lose heart. It is easy to stop loving. It is easy to grow angry. It is easy to become bitter and resentful. At the moments of weakness and rejection we must recall that the joy of life depends not so much on what we do or others do to us, but on what God does through us. He has in himself all power to protect us, all wisdom to direct us, all mercy to save us and all happiness to crown us.

Welcome back to Mass and Community: Thanks be to God, for he is answering our prayers! With the COVID-19 pandemic subsiding, we can return to the holy Mass and Communion. Archbishop Hebda announced that the Sunday Mass obligation will return the weekend of July 3-4. All are welcome to join the community for the celebration of the holy Mass.


The Parish Pastoral Council (JMT) and trustees discussed the possibility of three weekend Masses instead of four. The idea of a three Mass weekend has been discussing for years in our parishes. This was done at many other parishes where there is one priest with two parishes. It may reduce the work load of priests in multiple parishes. Saturdays may have funerals, weddings and confessions. After the discussions, it was decided that three Masses for a weekend between Ascension and St. Bernard. 1st and 3rd Saturdays of the month at St Bernard’s, and 2nd 4th (and 5th) at Ascension. The Saturday Mass will be 5pm at both parishes. All these weekend Mass schedule changes will start the weekend of July 3 & 4th.

Hearing Confessions in the confessional will resume on July 3rd. It will be on Saturdays at 4:30 pm (follow the Saturday Mass rotation), Tuesdays at 5.45 pm at Ascension and Wednesday at 7:30 am at St. Bernard.

Thank you for all your cooperation and understanding this past year during the pandemic. Let us all work together to make this a safe and healthy year going forward for the fellowship, communion and the Eucharist.

Frequently, families who once sat together every week in church are now scattered all over the spiritual spectrum. 
