



Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time - August 22, 2021



Dear Sisters and Brothers,

“Lord, to Whom Shall We Go?”

“Unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life in you.” Then many of his disciples who were listening said, “This saying is hard; who can accept it?” Since Jesus knew that his disciples were murmuring about this, he said to them, “Does this shock you?” It is then that Jesus turns to the Twelve. “Do you also wish to leave me?” Peter speaks for all: “Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God.” (John 6: 69)

For the five weeks, we have been reflecting on the theme of Jesus the **Bread of eternal life**. This Sunday we conclude our reflection of St John’s gospel chapter six, the basis for the belief about the **Real Presence of Christ in the Holy Eucharist**. Only with an unconditional trust in Jesus will we have that deeper insight into the real meaning of Jesus’ words. It requires an absolutely open mind ready to receive what is there, not what we put there. And this is a gift of God: “For this reason I have told you that no one can come to me unless it is granted by the Father.”

Because of Jesus’ words many of his disciples turned back and no longer accompanied him. Those words “turned back” are very sad. This is even worse, a turning back to their former ways of life. The word conversion means a turning towards God. To be a Christian is not an easy life. These are among the saddest words in the Gospel. This could happen to any of us. Perhaps we too will feel like leaving Jesus, leaving his Church. Perhaps we have had that experience already. It can be very painful. There are many reasons why this can happen: poorly instructed in the Christian faith so that we go around with a distorted understanding of the Gospel message, negative witness, scandalizing behavior from other Christians, be they clergy or lay people, the powerful attraction of a seductive world which is not compatible with the Christian values.


On the other hand, many have reflected that, in spite of the difficulties and doubts, there is really no viable alternative to the way of life that Jesus proposes. It is a way of life that is not invalidated by the words or actions of others. Faith in Jesus Christ is not simply a set of ideas to be held on to. It is a living relationship with Jesus Christ and his vision of life. It is a relationship that needs to grow and be deepened. It is a relationship that has constantly to be renewed in a constantly changing world. Jesus says, “Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him.”

Jesus is inviting you to be with him. We have the opportunity for **Eucharistic Adoration** on every Tuesday from 3:00 pm to 6:00 pm at Ascension and on every Wednesday from 2:00 pm to 7:00 pm at St. Bernard. Jesus is waiting for you to be with him at least a few minutes and experience his love and peace.


It is not enough for him to come to you; you also have to go all the way to him, with him. When the priest says, offering the Bread: “The Body of Christ”, you respond with ‘Amen’. That ‘Yes’ is not only just an act of faith in the Real Presence but also a total commitment of yourself to Jesus in the community of which you are a member. Jesus is inviting us to follow him, to be with him, to share totally and unconditionally in his mission. The special way in which we strengthen ourselves of this calling is through our **celebration of the Eucharist**, where we eat the Body and the drink the Blood. But we need to remember that this is a sacrament that points to the deeper reality, our ongoing relationship with Jesus Christ. In celebrating the Eucharist, we are saying that we want to **deepen that relationship with Jesus**, with his Gospel, and with the community. This life in Christ is the nourishment of our life. Without this Food and Drink, we will die of starvation; our bodies will keep going but in a very real sense, spiritually, we will have died.

Every weekend Mass, more people are participating the Mass. I am looking forward to seeing all of you in the church for the Mass since the most pandemic restrictions were lifted in Minnesota.

**You have the words

WE FACE THE SAME QUESTION: CAN WE STAY WITH JESUS? The people who were frenetically following Jesus, crossing the lake twice to pursue him, eating the bread he miraculously provided, are now puzzled by Jesus proclaiming himself as “the bread of life,” and they are incredulous. They can go with him no farther, so they gradually drift away. The Twelve, however, stay with Jesus. What else could

they do? Who else offers such a profound vision of human life? Peter expresses it well: “Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life.” Not all of our life’s crossroads involve our faith, but some do. Perhaps there is someone in your parish who chose to become Catholic and is now alienated from their family; someone who is unhappy with a new pastor and wondering about looking for a different parish; someone who was especially distressed by the clergy sex abuse and prayed long and hard before deciding that she needed her parish to get through it. There may be many in your parish facing such choices, and they need our support and our prayers. 

