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

Love Makes Suffering Redemptive

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Who is Jesus Christ to each of us? Who is Jesus to me personally? We believe that Jesus is to us the “Messiah”, the Savior who is the “Way” to life. His way is the way of the cross. Jesus says, “For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and that of the gospel will save it.” (Mark 8:35). Jesus teaches his disciples that he must suffer greatly and be killed, and rise after three days. But it is hard for the disciple to accept the suffering of Jesus.

St. Therese's of Lisieux had intense sufferings and hardships in her life. For her the meaning of suffering is grounded in its unity with love. Suffering is an integral part of love, as God's grace and privilege of love. They are inseparable because suffering is also an expression of the divine love of Jesus Christ to love and save all souls. She embraced suffering as a means to participate in Jesus' redemptive works to save souls. St. Therese integrated her suffering with her simple and childlike desires to love Christ and make him loved on earth and in heaven.

The fact is that no one escapes the cross. Every one suffers in some way. The personal cross that Jesus asks each of us to carry may not be the same for all. It may be personal sickness, pain, worry, rejection of love, humiliations, the loss of loved ones, joblessness, and old age. Through suffering we come to glory. The Cross led to Christ's glory and it will lead to ours as well.


The greatest tragedy in the world is not that there is suffering, but that so much of it is wasted. Our suffering must be borne with love. It is not suffering that redeems but only love redeems. It is only love that makes suffering redemptive. The important thing in life is not the sorrow and suffering that befall us. The important thing is how we respond to them. The important thing is what we do about them. May be we can't avoid sorrow and suffering, but we can do something with them. We can turn them into something constructive, not destructive. We can turn them into something that is life-giving, not death dealing. We can turn them into something that makes us better, not bitter.

At the height of his writing career, Oscar Wilde (Irish poet and playwright) was convicted of a charge against morals. After he returned from the prison, he could no longer write superficial comedies. He wrote, in what has to be one of the most beautiful lines of poetry ever written, “Where sorrow is, there is holy ground.” (*De Profundis* –a long letter which discusses his spiritual journey through his trials.) And in another beautiful line, he wrote, “How else but through the broken heart may the Lord enter in?” (*The Ballad of Reading Gaol*). Oscar Wilde used his humiliating experience as an occasion to grow and became better. In the spirit of the gospel, he turned it into an experience that was life-giving, not death-dealing.

Sooner or later we also realize that sorrow and suffering are not necessarily death-dealing. God often uses sorrow and suffering to fashion into better people, more understanding people, warmer people, humbler people, and more compassionate people. Sorrow and suffering can open our eyes to a richer and more beautiful life than we ever dreamed possible.

Life is a tough preposition, for suffering is part of it. The Lord does not ask us to submit ourselves to sufferings in fatalistic spirit. We must take all legitimate steps to remove and prevent all unnecessary sufferings. But if, in spite of that, we have still to suffer especially along our journey in faith towards full Christian maturity, we are asked to take them on willingly. To deny oneself, may be needed to resist temptations of life. Pain and suffering shatter the illusion of man's self-sufficiency, breaking through the deception that we are in control of our life, and compelling us to look towards God, the source of all comforts. God invites us to take up our cross with decision and with faith. Our life should be a continuous and permanent offering to God. Only in this way we can follow him as he asks.

IT'S ALL ABOUT CONTROL

From toddlerhood to old age, we grow in mastery of our own lives, our bodies, and our destiny. This mastery is hard won, and we don't let go of autonomy easily. Much of this self-mastery involves the avoidance of pain or discomfort, so when we hear things like "take up your cross" and "lose your life," we tend to resist the message.

James says that faith without works is dead. Ouch! That is really a direct message! One way to look at this, as well as the part about losing our life to find it, is that faith is a process of more and more openness to God's direction of our lives. It is very hard for us to give up control, but perhaps what we are being asked to do is not to become passive and babyish, but to allow God to direct where our self-mastery will lead and what it will accomplish. We are asked to relinquish the need to control the results of our efforts; to risk, as Jesus did, the loss of everything we are working to achieve. We are asked to let God take the lead and to control the results, even though we may never see those results.


