

The Greatest is the Servant

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

At the screening of the film, “*Mother Teresa*”, during the celebration of the fortieth anniversary of the United Nations in 1983, the Secretary General, Javier Perez de Cuellar, introduced Mother Teresa to an elite gathering of the representatives of the member countries of the UN. He needed only one sentence for his introduction: “*I present to you the most powerful woman in the world!*”

Mother Teresa’s power consisted in humble, sacrificial, and Christian service to the humanity. She was a living proof of Jesus’ words in today’s gospel. When the Apostles argue among themselves as to who among them is the greatest, Jesus calls a child into their midst and thus begins to teach them the greatness of the Christian life: “If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be last of all and the servant of all.” (Mark 9:35) True greatness consists in serving one’s fellow men and is never self-centered. It lies in the ability to see and respond to the needs of others and it presupposes compassion and sympathy. Jesus, himself, is our model. He came not to be served, but to serve (Matthew 20:28). Paul the Apostle states that Jesus emptied himself and took the form of a servant (Philippians 2:7).

Jesus wants his disciples to substitute for their ambition to rule to serve, thus becoming the greatest. We are all supposed to be serving, whatever our position or role in the society, in the family or in the Church may be, because true greatness lies in being the servant of all. Ambition to rule always looks for its own positions and privileges by means of excuses, while desire to service seeks for opportunities to find privileges for others through sacrificial love.

The second reading is in tune with the dispute among the apostles about who is the greatest. St. James warns us that selfish ambitions destroy peace and cause conflicts and war. He advises us to choose the path of righteousness and humble service which leads to lasting peace. (James 3:16--4:3)


The humanity is still arguing and fighting about who is the greatest. Worldly understanding of greatness comes from enough wealth, influence, reputation and power to do whatever one wants. Jesus, on the other hand, reveals that human greatness has to do with living the truth of our relationship with God and with each other regardless of how much wealth or power we may possess.

The secret of understanding the greatness of Jesus and thereby the meaning of human greatness is to understand the relationship of Jesus with God. Jesus also reveals that our relationship with God is inseparable from our relationship with each other. Jesus calls us to seek the greatness by the loving service. Only by following in the way of Jesus we will be on the path to greatness.

Jesus calls us to set aside our own desires for the sake of others. Every day, every moment of the day you and I are called to consider others over ourselves. The needs of the children, the sick, the poor and the elderly call us away from ourselves and call us into Jesus. Every day we have to resist the temptation to selfishness, the temptation to put ourselves before others.

God will make the humble great and the world will realize it when the time comes. We need to ask the Holy Spirit to help us to become truly great through humble and selfless service. St Teresa of Calcutta puts it: “The fruit of Silence is Prayer. The fruit of Prayer is Faith. The fruit of Faith is Love. The fruit of Love is Service. And the fruit of Service is Peace.”



Today's first two readings present a striking contrast between two pathways in life. In Wisdom and the letter from James we are told of the path of the wicked, which leads to oppression and violence. We also hear of the path of the faithful, which leads to peace and human flourishing. Then our Gospel reading from Mark takes our reflection farther. The choice is shown to be not so simple or obvious. The path of faithfulness means following Jesus' lead, to expand our circle of care toward everyone, especially the most vulnerable. This path also includes opening ourselves to suffering and trials, as we face resistance from within and from outside us. The two paths essentially diverge over whether we refuse or accept God's love. Each day we face such choices as God invites us into the divine circle of care and enlists us to extend our own circle to those around us. *Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co., Inc.*


