

What must I do to Inherit Eternal Life?"

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

A rich young man approaches Jesus and enquires about what he must do to inherit eternal life. (Mark 10:17-27). Jesus replies that one must observe the Commandments to inherit eternal life. The man acknowledges that he has observed all of these since his childhood. Jesus then says that only one thing is lacking: "Sell what you have, and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, follow me." Jesus answer disappoints him. He goes away sad, because he had great possessions. He prefers his possessions to eternal life. He placed his hope and security in what he possessed. He was afraid to give to others for fear that he would lose what he had gained.

The man in the gospel is nameless, which might mean that he stands for every one. The man is not told just to give alms generously to the poor. He is told to sell all his property and give it to the poor. The Gospel is not about giving donations from one's surplus; it is about sharing what one has with one's brothers and sisters. The Gospel is really interested in sharing, not just in almsgiving. Those who are generous towards God and towards their neighbor find that they cannot outgive God in his generosity towards us. God blesses us with the priceless treasures of his kingdom. He alone can truly satisfy the deepest longing and desires of our heart.

Jesus was not against wealth. He had many friends who were well-to-do, including some tax collectors. One even became an apostle. Hence, what Jesus is actually telling us is that riches give a false sense of security demanding the total loyalty of one's heart and forgets eternal life. The possessions may cause to forget that we are only stewards of God's gift and to blind us to the needs of others. Wealth can lead us into hurtful desires and selfishness (1 Timothy 6:9-10). Recall the lesson Jesus gave about the rich man and his sons who refused to aid the poor man Lazarus (Luke 16:19ff).


The gospel passage reminds us that we are stewards not the owners. God alone is the owner. This passage addresses the topic of generosity with the God-given resources at our disposal. We are invited to examine the gift of time, talent and wealth, asking how best to use these gifts for the building up of God's kingdom. And while the very human tendency is to suppose that such wealth is ours, something we have worked hard to achieve or attain. But the truth is that whatever we have is given from above, a gift to be used in continuing God's work on earth, the advancement of the heavenly kingdom in our midst, and thus to inherit the eternal life. October is the month of stewardship. On this month, we are praying, thinking, and acting in a special way as good stewards of God. We will hear more about stewardship in coming weeks.

Thank you for your generosity and willingness to share God's blessings with our parish community.

Welcome June Marjorie Teigland !



**BIBLICAL GENEROSITY**

Today's Gospel describes a tense and tragic encounter between Jesus and a wealthy man. It appears that the man sincerely desired to know the way to inherit eternal life. He had followed much of the Law of Moses. Apparently, he had also followed society's rules in gaining and sustaining his wealth, avoiding stealing and defrauding.

Jesus indicates that the man missed a crucial part of the Biblical tradition, which calls upon those who have much to share generously with those who have little. The Old Testament regularly refers to this obligation (for example, see Deuteronomy 15). Historians note that in the society in Jesus' day, the wealthy enjoyed privileges in an economic system that also prevented the poor and vulnerable from meeting their basic needs. The wealthy man's entrapment in his possessions damaged both himself and the whole community. In our own time and place, those of us who enjoy privileges of various kinds are invited into social and economic practices that embrace this biblical generosity.



