



### The Righteous will Survive the Tribulation

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

St. Francis of Assisi was weeding his garden one day. A friend approached him and asked, “What would you do if you learned you would die before the sun set?” St. Francis reflected for a moment and replied, “I would finish weeding my garden. I would be faithful to what I am doing now.”

As we come close to the end of the Liturgical Year, our Scriptural readings remind us of the end of the world and the Second Coming of Christ. Next Sunday is the 34th and last Sunday in our Liturgical Year when we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King. And the following Sunday marks the beginning of the Advent Season with a new Liturgical Cycle- C. Each year at this time, the Church asks us to meditate on the “last things” - death, judgment, heaven and hell - as they apply to us. It is not to frighten us. It is intended to remind us to be prepared to receive Jesus at his second coming by doing now what he has commanded us to do.


In the second century BC, the Jews were conquered by the Greeks. They were persecuted and forced them to join in the worship of pagan gods. In this frightening and dangerous time, Daniel’s prophetic message with his vision of the archangel Michael, gave the Jewish people comfort and hope. This short chapter 12 also describes the “great tribulation,” the “resurrection of the dead” and the divine judgment with its rewards for the righteous and its punishments for the wicked. Thus, today’s reading from Daniel introduces the belief in the resurrection of the dead and makes the first mention in the Bible of ‘everlasting life,’ (Daniel 12:2), while such a doctrine was almost unknown to Jews even in the second century.

The gospel passage (Mark 13:24-32) offered hope to the early Christians persecuted by the Roman Emperor Nero. Many Christians began wondering why Jesus did not return as he had promised. Hence, Mark reminded them of Jesus’ words about his glorious return to earth as judge, with great power and glory, to gather and reward his elect. Though Daniel and Mark describe frightful scenes, their accounts also remind their audience that God will ensure that the righteous will survive the tribulation and will find a place with Him.

Through the parable of the fig tree, Jesus warns us all to read the “signs of the time.” The fig tree sprouts its leaves in late spring heralding the summer season. The application of this image to the end of the world suggests that the end of the world will mean good times, or summer, for Jesus’ disciples. Because their God will be bringing things to a triumphant end and His Truth, Love and Justice will prevail forever. But we must always be well prepared to face our judgment because we do not know “either the day or the hour” of our own death or of his second coming. Hence, true disciples are to watch and wait in a state of readiness. Instead of worrying about the end-time, we are asked to live in loving God who is with us every day in the Holy Eucharist, in the Holy Bible and in our worshipping communities, and to do his will by serving our brothers and sisters, recognizing his presence in them. Thus, we will enter into a deeper relationship with God which will continue when we pass through death to new life.

**World Day of the Poor:** In his Apostolic Letter, *Misericordia et Misera* (Mercy with Misery) on November 20, 2016, Pope Francis designated the 33rd Sunday of Ordinary Time “World Day of the Poor.” He wrote: “It will be a day that will help communities and each baptized person to reflect on how poverty is at the heart of the Gospel, and in the fact that, as long as Lazarus lies at the door of our homes (Lk 16:19-21) there can be no justice or social peace. This day will represent a genuine form of new evangelization (Mt 11: 5) which can renew the face of the Church as she perseveres in her perennial activity of pastoral conversion and witnesses to Mercy”.

## FEAST OF FAITH

- Blessing and Dismissal At the beginning of Mass, the priest makes the sign of the cross with us. At the conclusion of Mass, he makes the sign of the cross over us, a sign of blessing. We are then dismissed—not just let out, but sent forth with a mission “to love and serve the Lord.” Just as Jesus blessed his disciples as he ascended to heaven, so this leave-taking is joined to a blessing, a prayer for God’s continuing protection. As we leave the church, we bear the invisible sign of the Master whom we follow. In the words of an ancient letter to Diognetus, “Christians are indistinguishable from other [people] either by nationality, language, or customs. They do not inhabit separate cities of their own, or speak a strange dialect, or follow an outlandish way of life. . . . And yet, there is something extraordinary about their lives” (Liturgy of the Hours, Vol. II, p. 840). We are ordinary people sent forth to live extraordinary lives, lives like Christ’s own life—pouring ourselves out for others in prayer, service, and love. —Corinna Laughlin, Copyright © J. S. 


