

“Glory to God in the Highest”

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

“God so loved the world that he sent His only Son so that everyone who believes in Him may not die, but have eternal life.” (John 3: 16). This is the Good News. This is Christmas. God became man to save us from our sins and sickness. God became man to identify with us in our sufferings and pain. In the person of Jesus Christ, God decided to become a lowly human being. He decided to declare His love for us in a way that we would understand perfectly and respond to freely. St. Paul refers to this incredible love this way in his Letter to the Philippians: “Christ Jesus always had the nature of God, but he gave up all he had and took the nature of a servant, coming in human likeness...” (Phil 2:6-7).

The angels welcomed Jesus’ birth singing: “Glory to God in the highest and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests.” (Lk 2:14). The song of the angels conveys the message that true peace on earth is available only to those with the good will. Christmas reminds us that God shared His love by giving us His Son. Hence, we also must share our love by sharing our gifts, wealth, talents and other blessings with others. Just as Jesus shared His love with all mankind we too are called to share our love with others, especially the less fortunate than us. Sharing love is the sign that one has the “good will” of which the angel spoke. The peace of Christmas is promised only to those who have good will.

Christmas is the feast of God’s sharing love with us. Jesus as our Savior brought the “Good News” that our God is a loving, forgiving, merciful and rewarding God. Jesus demonstrated by his life, teaching and death how God our heavenly Father loves us, forgives us, and provides for us. Christmas reminds us that sharing love with others is our Christian duty and that every time we do so, Jesus is reborn in our lives. There are so many experiencing pain, suffering, sickness, poverty, unhappiness and lack of peace around us. We may think that what I can do in such situations. No one can do everything, but, everyone can do something.

In this world I have a mission to complete, a task to fulfill. And this is only possible if I make a total response to God’s sharing and sacrificial love, that is Christmas. No one can do everything, but each of us can do something to bring peace and joy among our family and friends and glory to God. Let us sing together with the angels: “Glory to God in the highest”

Feast of the Holy Family: On the Sunday following Christmas, we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family. The Holy Family is the model for all the families of the world. A family is a Christian family if Jesus is at its center and love flourishes. A family is a Christian family where love is experienced, joy is shared and sorrow is eased. Let us entrust our families to the Holy Family: Jesus, Mary, and Joseph.

December 27th is the **Anniversary of my Ordination** to the Priesthood. I request your prayers.

Christmas is God saying, “I love you so much that I gave you my Son. Love one another as I love you.” And because of this great gift of God, we can truly say to all: ‘**Have a Merry Christmas.**’




