



Prepare for the Coming of the Lord

My Dear Sisters and Brothers,

On this Second Sunday of Advent, we hear the challenging call of John the Baptist, the baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins; and to prepare the way of the Lord (Lk 3: 1-6). We need to open ourselves to further conversion, to an ever deeper change of heart, to a deeper listening to what Jesus is asking of us, “Lord, what do you want me to do, to be?”

We need to find total reconciliation with God and with all those people who come into our lives. Forgiveness involves a total reconciliation with our God and with all those whom we have hurt or with whom we have come in conflict. It is a healing, a making whole. This is how we have to “prepare a way for the Lord.

Advent is a time to evaluate our actions, to see how we practice our Christian faith. John the Baptist invited us to prepare ourselves for the entry of Jesus into our lives. This preparation should include our firm resolution to change our lives and leave sin behind. We can do this by examining our conscience to identify our weak points and our strong points. Do we follow what the Lord asks of us in Holy Scripture? Or are we trying to make God accommodate himself to what is convenient for us? Let us confess our sins and humbly do whatever penance is necessary. In this way, we will be able to receive the Body and the Blood of Our Lord as we should and it will nourish us.

Doing charity is a good way of preparation for the coming of the Lord. We are doing various charitable works through out the year. This Advent season challenges us in a special way to announce the Good News to those who are suffering from various sickness and poverty. When we act in such a way that those who experience our sacrifice can say of us: This person follows Christ. In him or her, there is love of God.

Like John the Baptist, each one of us has a mission to communicate, the Spirit of Christ and his message of hope, love, freedom and peace. We are called to help people fill the valleys and make their rough paths smoother. A word of affirmation and encouragement can work wonders. To have a naturally cheerful disposition can be a real witness of Christian joy.

Advent is a time of special prayers, so that prayer opens our eyes to the presence of God, helping us to see everything in proper perspective and implants in our hearts peace even in the midst of problems and pains.

December 8th, the Solemnity of the **Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary**, Patronal Feast Day of the United States of America. It is a holy day of obligation. We have two Masses on the Feast day, 8:00 am at St. Bernard and 6:45pm at Ascension.

End of the Year of St. Joseph: The end of the Year of St. Joseph occurs on Wednesday **December 8, 2021**. Archbishop Hebda will mark the occasion with a special Mass that evening 7:00 pm at the Cathedral of St. Paul, to which all are invited. This Mass fulfills the obligation to attend Mass on the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception.
