



The Second Sunday In Ordinary Time - January 16, 2022

Invite Jesus and Mary in our Home

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

The Liturgical Calendar opens to us the Ordinary Season after the Feast of the Baptism of our Lord. In most years, the Sunday after January 6 is the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. In countries such as the United States, however, where the celebration of Epiphany is transferred to Sunday if that Sunday is January 7 or 8, Epiphany is celebrated instead. As feasts of our Lord, both the Baptism of the Lord and Epiphany displace a Sunday in Ordinary Time. Thus, the first Sunday in the period of Ordinary Time is the Sunday that falls after the first week of Ordinary Time, which makes it the Second Sunday of Ordinary Time.

Since the term ordinary often means something that's not special or distinctive, many people think that Ordinary Time refers to parts of the calendar of the Catholic Church that are unimportant. Ordinary Time refers to those periods that fall outside of the major liturgical seasons that aren't included in the major seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter. The first period of Ordinary Time runs until Ash Wednesday when the liturgical season of Lent begins. The Ordinary Time resumes again on the Monday after Pentecost Sunday, the end of the Easter season. The second period of Ordinary Time runs until the First Sunday of Advent when the liturgical year begins again.

The Ordinary Time represents the ordered life of the Church, the period in which we live our lives neither in feasting (as in the Christmas and Easter seasons) or in more severe penance (as in Advent and Lent), but in watchfulness and expectation of the Second Coming of Christ. (The normal liturgical color for Ordinary Time is green. Green vestments and altar cloths have traditionally been associated with the time after Pentecost, the period in which the Church founded by the risen Christ and enlivened by the Holy Spirit began to grow and to spread the Gospel to all nations.)

The expression Ordinary Season does not in any way mean that this period is less important but signifies the period in which the synthesis of the life and ministry of Jesus Christ as recorded in the Gospels is recounted to us during the year. During this Season, we are invited to walk with our Lord and to sanctify ourselves and our days with his teachings and to practice the virtues which the various mysteries of the life of Christ inspire within us.

It is appropriate, therefore, that the Gospel for the Second Sunday of Ordinary Time (which is actually the first Sunday celebrated in Ordinary Time) features either John the Baptist's acknowledgment of Christ as the Lamb of God or Christ's first miracle, the transformation of water into wine at the wedding at Cana.

In today's Gospel (John 2:1-11), we hear the story of Jesus' first miracle at the wedding feast at Cana according to St. John. Jesus and Mary were invited. As the wedding feast went on, the wine ran out. Mary went out of her way to intercede with Jesus and Jesus performed his very first miracle. Mary did not play the passive role of being the physical mother of Jesus, instead, she was actively involved with Jesus in the work of our redemption. Jesus' presence saved the wedding family from the shame of insufficient wine for their occasion.

On a deeper reflection, Jesus comes to turn our imperfections to perfections. As we continue to invite Jesus in our home, may Mary our mother, intercessor and perpetual helper take us and our families to Jesus her son, so that our imperfections will be turned to perfections, our insufficiency to abundance, our problems to solutions and our disappointments into joy.

In the Gospel scene at Cana, we see Mary turning to her own child, Jesus. Perhaps she recalled the power of the Spirit that had flowed in her womb at his Incarnation, leading her to discern that surely he must have Spirit-given gifts that could help with the impending crisis at the wedding. As at her Annunciation,

she may not have been completely certain, at first, exactly how this would come about, but in faith at Cana she turned to Jesus. In faith, her words, "do whatever he tells you," echoed her reply to Gabriel: "Let it be done to me as you say." In faith, she knows whatever words the Word will speak are bound to bring another inbreaking of the Spirit, another manifestation of God's reign. And she is right. 
