

Response to the Word of God

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Jesus returned to his home town (Luke 4:21-30). At first, Jesus was received with enthusiasm. The people were amazed at the gracious words of Jesus. “All speaks highly of him.” They also asked, “Isn’t this the son of Joseph?” They thought that they know him, but actually they did not. Jesus is the Son of God. Familiarity breeds contempt. In different degrees and on many occasions, we are also guilty of this thing. There is a tendency in us to discriminate against people according to their appearance, background and status in life. This blinds us from giving respect and loving concern for what they are. We fail to grasp the truth that their dignity lies on the fact that we are children of God.

Jesus spoke the truth which was not pleasing to some people. So, they rejected him. Many of the people were not expecting a spiritual kingdom of God, but a political Messiah. Some people like to hear the words which are politically correct, not morally or actually right. Jesus was not acceptable to many, as he was not speaking politically correct. Jesus gave his heavenly Father’s message. So, his words and teachings were not appealing to many people. That made him a victim of frequent false accusations, and attempts to kill and crucify him at the end.

For many, Jesus was a looser, as he didn’t change his way of preaching by adapting a politically correct method. He continued his preaching, the life-giving words of the heavenly Father. For Jesus, the truth was not to be hidden, but to be proclaimed, whether it hurts someone or not. For Jesus, if the truth hurts anybody, that is a call for repentance and conversion. This is what happened in the life of Herod, many of the Pharisees, Zacchaeus, Peter, St. Paul, and thousands and thousands of people in history. For some it caused repentance and conversion, while for many it caused anger, revenge and departure.

A life of love and truth invite hardships and sufferings for the good of others. We will be rejected because of our faith in Jesus. There we can rightly be assured of Jesus’ presence and support as he has suffered all these things before us to give us courage. Every believer in Christ, needs to live an authentic life by performing their roles and heading towards the Heavenly Kingdom, with love and charity.

If we have loved the way that Christ has loved, then we will stand before the heavenly Father. If we have loved as he calls us to love, we will be absorbed by Him. We will see him face to face. We are not always so comfortable with the happenings of life. But God has a unique plan for everything. He wants us to live our lives with a focus on love. He is considering not our immediate happiness but our eternal happiness.

YOU'VE BEEN WARNED

The opening of the reading selected from Jeremiah is surely one of the most comforting in scripture. Imagine! God knew me before my bodily conception; God dedicated me before my birth or any human dedication rites; God appointed me a prophet! Then comes the uh-oh. Jeremiah is warned that his appointment as a prophet will bring opposition, against which God's prophets must stand up. Somehow the appointment as God's prophet seems like it should be a bit happier, with the glamor that we might think will come from having friends in high places. Yet, just as there are many forces in the world arrayed against the divine will and divine goodness, so too are they arrayed against God's prophets. A second round of assurances comes to Jeremiah, a pledge that God will be with Jeremiah to strengthen him. God doesn't promise a turmoil-free life, but does vow to be Jeremiah's strength. **JESUS, SON OF JEREMIAH** In the synagogue at Nazareth, a similar turn of events takes place. When Jesus speaks of the Spirit's anointing being upon him, the anointing described in Isaiah, the crowd is amazed, and seems like they even want to take credit, since he's a local boy. Then Jesus speaks some words of tough love, and "local boy" pivots to "who does he think he is?" You couldn't blame Jesus, in that moment, if he recalled the words of Jeremiah, his prophetic ancestor. Though the crowd drove Jesus out of town and up a hill to throw him to his death, his time had not yet come. The strength and protection that God promises to prophets came for Jesus that day, as he passed through the mob's midst, unharmed. He passed through their midst to continue the work for which the Spirit had anointed him. For us who follow the prophetic heritage of Jesus this day, we've been warned. But we've also been assured of God's care.


