



### “Love Your Enemies”

Sisters and Brothers,

This Sunday we hear some of the most difficult teachings of Jesus Christ. (Luke 6:27-38) Jesus tells us “love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you. To the person who strikes you on one cheek, offer the other one as well, and from the person who takes your cloak, do not withhold even your tunic.” It is a new commandment because, it over rules the Old Testament law of retaliation or retributive justice. There is no doubt that, humanly speaking, it is a very difficult one. However, it demands a lot of sacrifice and courage.

Jesus rejects even the mild form of retaliation. For Jesus, retaliation, or grudge has no place in the Christian life. Jesus wants his disciples to repay evil with kindness. Instead of retaliation, Jesus gives his new law of love: love your enemies.

The Greek word used for loving enemies is not ‘*storge*’ (natural love towards family members) or ‘*philia*’ (love of close friends) or ‘*eros*’ (passionate love between a man and woman), but ‘*agape*’ which is the invincible, unshakable, supreme benevolence or good will for another’s highest good. ‘*Agape*’ love is a choice more than a feeling. We choose to love, not because our enemies deserve our love, but because Jesus loves them so much that he died for them. For us Jesus is the model for this love. Jesus loves each one of us even though we do not deserve it. Jesus forgave and prayed for his enemies on the cross. We have in the Acts of the Apostles the example of St. Stephen, the first martyr who prayed for those who were putting him to death.

Jesus demands that we should forgive, pardon and be generous whether or not our offenders deserve it, and even if we are not loved in return. He also tells us to pray for those who willfully cause us suffering, hardship and unhappiness. Jesus reminds us to be merciful just as our heavenly Father is merciful.

These teachings are so against our modern ways of thinking! Yes, these same teachings would revolutionize our present world if we all lived them. Let us pray today that our hearts might truly be open to forgiveness and to the acceptance of being treated badly. Let us love all of our enemies: the enemies of our country, the enemies of our families, our personal enemies, the enemies of our Church and whatever enemy there is. Let us learn to do good for all of these enemies. Let us bless them and pray for them. What a world we can create together if we walk this path with our Lord Jesus Christ. In our celebration of the Holy Mass today, may God give us strength. Let us remember this phrase from today’s Gospel: “For the measure with which you measure will in return be measured out to you.”

**Lenten Fasting and Abstinence**

**Abstinence** – Catholics 14 years of age and older must abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all the Fridays of Lent. It is only on other Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, that a Catholic may substitute another form of penance instead of abstinence.

**Fasting** – Catholics between the age of 18 and 59 inclusive are required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On these days one full meal is allowed if necessary. Food may be taken at two other times, two smaller meals, in order to maintain strength according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted. Liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed, however.

**Love Your Enemies**

It's likely that some friends or followers of Jesus told him, from time to time, to "get real" when his teachings seemed too hard or impractical. John's Gospel, near the end of the Bread of Life discourse, reports that some disciples out and out turned away because it

was too hard to continue following Jesus. When Jesus said to love our enemies, pray for those who hurt us, or do good for those who hate us, the response, "get real," wouldn't be surprising. And yet, the very life and witness of Jesus is filled with his prophetic examples of doing just that; of refusing to return harm for harm. The lives of the saints are likewise filled with such examples, especially those saints who were laborers in the field for justice and peace. Is this command of Jesus difficult? Yes. Is it impossible? No.
