

“Cast the Net over the Right side of the Boat”

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Simon Peter and his companions have returned to Galilee apparently out of sadness and a sense of defeat after the crucifixion of Jesus. They went back to their old business, that was fishing. They had spent the whole night on the water and they had caught nothing. Remember that they were expert fishermen.

All their works seem futile, a painful experience shared by many people today also. At dawn as they approached shore, Jesus was standing there. And he asked them, “Cast the net over the right side of the boat.” What is remarkable is that they obeyed him. Without listening to the Lord, we may cast the net on the wrong side. They didn't recognize the Lord until they saw the result of listening to him. Once again, the apostle experienced the power of the words of Jesus and the futility of human effort with out the Lord. “With out me you can do nothing.” (John 15:6). With Jesus, we are heroes but without him we are zeroes. We are no longer in charge of the world or even our life. God is the owner of everything.

Friendship with Jesus and listening to him are the essential things of life, regardless of any other circumstance, sickness or health, poverty or wealth, low or high position in society or church. That is the supreme truth the gospel wants to tell us. Jesus desires our friendship, and offers it to all who welcome him in faith. We can identify with many of the persons Jesus encounters in the gospel - the Samaritan woman, Martha and Mary, Lazarus, Peter, Mary Magdalene, and the beloved disciple. The gospel also warns us not to identify with those who reject friendship, and even betray friendship with Jesus.

A personal, loving relationship with the Risen Lord clearly was a distinguishing characteristic of Christian community. However, individual relationship with Jesus is not sufficient to hold the community together. When the risen Lord appeared to his disciples the first time, Thomas was away from the community. In other words, Thomas got the chance to see the Lord only when he was with the community. Two of the disciples went away from Jerusalem to Emmaus with disappointment, but the Lord brought them back to the community of the disciples by inspiring them with the Scripture and the breaking of the Bread.

The Risen Lord entrusted a specific authority to Peter. The authority that Jesus gives, however, must be exercised out of deep love and friendship with him. “Do you love me?” Jesus asks Peter the crucial question three times, as he commissions him to tend and to feed his sheep. Perhaps this is a good weekend to examine our conscience. Do I listen to the word of Jesus and obey him? Do I have a personal relationship with Jesus and his community? We can get that relationship with Jesus through prayer, reception of Eucharist, works of charity, scripture study, spiritual reading, etc.

Confirmation: This is a special weekend for us. On April 30th Saturday, five young men and women from our Parish Communities were confirmed at St. Mary's Basilica. We pray for them that they may grow in faith and bear witness to Christ by their way of life. Congratulations.



REPEATED QUESTIONS

In today's Gospel, John sets the scene for Jesus' encounter with Peter, sitting by a "charcoal fire." There is just one other mention of a charcoal fire in John's Gospel: when Peter warms himself while awaiting Jesus' trial, and Peter goes on to deny knowing Jesus, three times. The evangelist directly links Jesus' three questions of Peter, "do you love me?", to Peter's three denials. Through his repeated questioning, Jesus helps Peter to face his actions fully, and to accept forgiveness fully as well. When God invites us into prayer, we may be invited to enter into deep conversation with God about our lives. God can pose the same questions to us, again and again over time, to face what we might prefer to avoid: Can you forgive someone who has hurt you? Can you be more generous? Can you let go of obstacles to becoming more loving? And even: Do you love me? Jesus' encounter with Peter suggests that we can face such questions with deep trust in God. *Copyright (c) J. S.*
