



The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) is the very center and heart of the Church and of our faith. Although we celebrate the institution of the Holy Eucharist on Holy Thursday, the Church wants to emphasize its importance by a special feast. It is a feast established for three main purposes: to give God collective thanks for Christ's abiding presence with us in the Eucharist and to honor him there; to instruct us in

the mystery, faith and devotion surrounding the Eucharist; and to teach us to appreciate and make use of the great gift of the Holy Eucharist both as a sacrament and as a sacrifice.

Our belief in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist derives from the promise of Christ to give his Body and Blood as our spiritual food and drink. It is found in the Gospels. Eucharistic theologians explain the real presence by a process called transubstantiation: the entire "substance" of bread and wine is changed into the glorified Body and Blood of Christ, retaining only the accidents, "taste, color, shape etc." of bread and wine.

The celebration of the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ is an opportunity for us to focus on the Mass and the Eucharist. The Eucharist is the Lord's dying gift to us. We receive His Body, His Blood, His humanity and Divinity. The act of receiving Holy Communion is meant to foster the abiding presence of the Lord in our soul and in our heart. The feast of the Body and Blood of Christ invites us to renew and deepen our faith in the Eucharist. When our faith in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist is strong, then our desire to attend Mass and to receive communion often is strong. Eucharistic devotions are meant to deepen our love for Christ really and truly present in the Eucharist.

Our parish is a Eucharistic community. We are truly blessed to have Eucharistic adoration on Tuesdays at Ascension and Wednesdays at St. Bernard. I express my sincere thanks to you for deciding to commit to Eucharistic Adoration. I am grateful to everyone who is helping to promote the Eucharistic adoration. Sign-up sheets for Adoration are available in the back of church. Holy Communion and Eucharistic adoration strengthen our unity, mutual love, and spiritual & physical health. We may be often spiritually sick. But we have our spiritual doctor and he cares for us. It is only by following his advice, and by using the spiritual nourishment he prescribes for us, that we can overcome our illness and weakness and keep on the narrow road to heaven.

On this **Father's Day**, we pray for all the men who continue to reflect the divine qualities of fatherhood as they lovingly establish, nourish and maintain a family. Fathers are a blessing, and we thank them for their lives of dedication, endurance and love. We also remember and pray for all the fathers who have gone to their eternal reward.

Father's Day is also a day to remember, acknowledge and appreciate the love and providence of our Heavenly Father. Let the earthly fathers draw strength from their Heavenly Father. On this Father's Day, please don't forget to pray for our spiritual Fathers, men who are called to be Fathers through the sacrament of Holy Orders.



Sacred Vessels

Have you ever paid attention to the purification of the sacred vessels after Holy Communion? If you haven't, I highly recommend doing so this Sunday. See the care with which the priest handles the chalice and the paten, pouring

water into them to cleanse any loose particles of the Body and Blood of Christ. Observe the loving reverence he uses in wiping them dry with a special purificator. It's a ritual unto itself, and a powerful moment for reflection.

These vessels begin as earthly objects. They are made by human hands. There is nothing special about them — not until they go about the work for which they have been created. Until they contain the Body and Blood of Christ, they are only ordinary objects. But after they have carried within them the Eucharist, they are never the same. They will always be special and deserving of special care.

That's why partaking of the Eucharist is, for us, an evangelical undertaking. It is both a transformation and a declaration. When we accept this tremendous gift, we are proclaiming what we believe, and we are accepting the grace to follow through on that commitment.

When we are receiving the Eucharist, it is not possible for us to be passive. We become the vessel. We carry Christ into the world with us. — *Tracy Earl Welliver, MTS* ©LPi


