



Respect Life



Dear Sisters and Brothers,

The first Sunday of October is observed as Respect Life Sunday. To respect life means to honor it, to protect it from conception to natural death. By this celebration of "Respect Life Sunday," we are once again reminded of our responsibility to pray and work to eliminate all kinds of violence against human life and human dignity.

The Bible teaches that life is a gift of God and hence we have to respect it from womb to tomb. Based on the word of God, the Church teaches that an unborn child from the moment of its conception in its mother's womb, is precious because it carries an immortal soul. All kinds of violence against human person and life are against the violation of the Commandment: "You shall not kill."

"Respect Life" is a broad concept. Today, we cannot address all the issues related to life. But we have to ponder on human life and dignity in our own family and parish contexts. Parents have the special responsibility to protect and respect the life of their children as a gift of God, by providing food, health care, education, and all other things needed. Yet the gift of life cannot be respected fully by providing material things alone. Children must be fed with faith, the Word of God and moral values. May we hold fast to Christ our hope, from the beginning of life to its very end.

The Apostles requested Jesus: "Increase our faith." And Jesus answered: "If you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you would say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you." (Luke 17:5-6). Faith is a gift of God. It comes to us from God through Baptism. We have the obligation to nourish this gift. For faith to be effective, it must be linked with trust, obedience and prayer.

Prayer is an integral part of faith. Prayer is the way of communicating with God and asking for whatever we need in the name of Jesus. God knows everything about us, but there is something about sharing your thoughts, concerns, and desires with God that reveals a spiritual intimacy with Him. However, prayer is more than talking to God but it also involves listening to God. Prayer is one of the most powerful weapons that we have, as believers. Consistency in prayer builds up our faith in God. The more we stay in prayer, the more God reveals Himself to us because we are his beloved children.

October is the month of devotion to Rosary. We pray Rosary twenty-five minutes before every weekend Mass with special intentions. You are welcome to join us.

Pancake Breakfast




The Ascension KC's will be hosting a **pancake breakfast** on Sunday, October 9th in the newly remodeled Ascension social hall. Serving

Anointing of the Sick: will occur following the 5pm Mass on October 8th at Ascension and after the 10am Mass on October 9th at St. Bernard. The Rite of Anointing tells us there is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness is sufficient. When the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is given, the hoped-for effect is that, if it be God's will, the person be physically healed of illness. But even if there is no physical healing, the primary effect of the Sacrament is a spiritual healing by which the sick person receives the Holy Spirit's gift of peace and courage to deal with the difficulties that accompany serious illness or the frailty of old age.

FIND FREEDOM IN OBEDIENCE

As adults, unless we are dealing with children, “obedience” is not a word we typically like to hear. It often brings connotations of military protocols, deference to superiors at work, or conforming to laws and practices. In a culture that has learned to challenge authority, being obedient is understood more as something I “have” to do, not “want” to do. Do you ever see merit in wanting to be obedient? Giving ourselves over to the will of another, especially when done blindly, can sometimes carry more risk than we are willing to take. Also, blindly following orders without any deference to ethics or morality can lead to atrocious crimes and violence against humanity.

We ask God to increase our faith. In other words, increase our trust that God knows best how to live and act in this world. We desire the same confidence, determination, and patience Jesus had that the fulfillment of God's vision would one day come. Nurturing a deep love of God and trusting in his providence, we obediently do what we know is pleasing to God: love, repent of sin, show mercy, be compassionate and fight injustice. As we willingly give witness to our faith, we do only what we are obliged to do, expecting nothing in return. 
