



Use Wealth Wisely

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Our Lord expects faithful and prudent stewardship from us. He challenges us to use our talents and blessings wisely to attain heavenly kingdom. Jesus tells a paradoxical story about the steward of a rich absentee landlord. (Lk 16:1-13) The steward in the parable was dishonest. He misused the profit of the estate. Facing the return of his master and an audit of his accounts, the steward cleverly converted the debtors of his master into his own debtors. He bought friends with his master's money. His dishonest plan would serve the purpose: the debtors would be grateful to him and would support him financially when he was out of his job. The parable of the dishonest steward is hard to understand.

Obviously, Jesus was not commanding the steward's dishonesty. He was commanding only his shrewd resourcefulness in coping with an emergency with such speed. The parable points out that Christians should be as prudent and resourceful in acquiring goodness as the steward was in acquiring money and making his future safe. Christians must give as much attention to things that concern their souls as they do to the things that concern worldly matters. In saving our souls and spreading the Good News, our Lord wants us to apply the same resourcefulness and effort that other people put into their worldly affairs or into their attempts to attain some human ideal.

Jesus is teaching two lessons for us from the parable of the dishonest steward. Firstly, the shrewdness which the dishonest steward showed in providing for his earthly happiness was greater than that shown by most of us in providing for our eternal happiness. If we take an honest look at last week as a sample of our lives, how many hours did we spend on earning merit for any future life? How many of them did we devote to spiritual things? Did we give one hour a day to God and the things of God, helping the needy, learning more about our religion, praying for our own and our neighbor's needs? God gives us lots of time for providing for our health and temporal needs each week, and a lot of free time besides. We should not express surprise if he is disappointed at how little of that wonderful gift of time we are willing to give back to him. The unjust steward was far more enterprising with regard to earthly provisions for himself.

The second lesson our Lord wishes to teach us is that we should use our earthly possessions in helping those who need our help. The right use of wealth, according to Jesus in the Gospel of Luke, is to help the poor, the hungry, and the starving. That is the way that we make friends with God and please God according to this text. There are many people in our parish who live a life of generosity. There are many people in the Church who understand that God has given us money so that we can be generous to the needy, the poor and the starving. Thus, many of us are making wise investments for the future. Jesus reminds us that earthly resources will eventually run out. Hence, our material possessions should be used for the good of others and we will be received into eternal dwellings. The parable advises us to use our blessings: time, talents, opportunities, health, wealth, intelligence, education, and other advantages. It also challenges us to be honest stewards and to use our resources wisely so that they will count for our good in eternity.

"You cannot serve both God and mammon." Merriam-Webster defines mammon as material wealth or possessions, especially having a debasing influence. While God does not take issue with our need to use money for the business of our lives, there can be a problem with the attitudes we bring to it. We can easily become so preoccupied and obsessed with money that it becomes the real "god" we worship. Do we serve mammon instead of God? In their book, Wealth, Riches and Money, Craig Hill and Earl Pitts outline symptoms of mammon's influence in our lives. Some of these are worry and anxiety over money, money mismanagement, fear over "never having enough," an "I can't afford it" mentality, impulse buying, stinginess, greed, debt, and discontent.

Many of the things on that list can consume us to the point that we are distracted from what we really need to be doing. Many of the world's problems, especially those involving inequity and injustice, result from conflicts about money. Many equate money with happiness. Those successful in accumulating large amounts of it quickly realize just how wrong they are.

"Your ultimate allegiance is not to the government, not to the state, not to nation, not to any man-made institution. The Christian owes his ultimate allegiance to God, and if any earthly institution conflicts with God's will it is your Christian duty to take a stand against it. You must never allow the transitory evanescent demands of man-made institutions to take precedence over the eternal demands of the Almighty God (Martin Luther King, Jr.)." This is the point Jesus is trying to make. Unfortunately, when we look around our man-made kingdoms are far more prevalent than God's kingdom. When we start seeing greater evidence of justice, equity, dignity, respect, opportunity, gentleness, holiness, solidarity, honesty, simplicity, care for creation, and a decrease in ambition, then we will know that God's kingdom is being served. 
