



The Cost of Being a Christian

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Many Christians had physically sacrificed their lives for their faith in Christ. We call them martyrs. This Sundays' gospel is challenging: "If any one comes to me without hating his father or mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple" (Lk 14:26). Jesus really is not telling us to hate people. But he is telling us that nothing can get in the way of following him. I cannot love my family more than Jesus. I can't love wealth and esteem more than Jesus. I can't love material goods more than Jesus. We need to be committed to the path of discipleship. Discipleship requires putting Jesus over and above our family, job, money, career, and even our life. We find this when we look at its parallel passage in the gospel according to Matthew. It says, "Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me; and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me; and whoever does not take up the cross and follow me is not worthy of me." (Mt 10:37-38).

Following Jesus requires that we bear our cross patiently. It includes what we do voluntarily, as a consequence of our commitment to Jesus Christ. Further, it is the spirit in which we freely and deliberately accept and endure the pain, difficulties and even the ridicule involved with these choices that transforms them into real cross-bearing. Bearing a cross is often equated with accepting illness, painful physical conditions, or trying family relationships.

Using the two parables of the tower-builder and the king defending his country, Jesus says: think long and hard about discipleship before a decision is made. Jesus reminds us to count the cost of being a disciple because the cost is high. When we first decide to follow Christ, we know simply that there will be a price to pay. Only as life unfolds can we begin to assess the full cost. Jesus warns us to expect significant cost overruns because the cost for him was the cross at Calvary. For being a disciple of Jesus, we must love Christ most of all, with everything else finding its meaning in relation to God. Jesus invites us to take up our cross and follow the way of sacrificial love.

Labor Day marks the end of summer vacation and the beginning of many regular parish and school activities. Our **Faith Formation** program for this school year begins on Wednesday, September 7th with the celebration of Mass. Parents, students and staff are encouraged to participate in the Mass. Catholic Tradition has always emphasized that faith, both begins and is nurtured in the family. It is the great responsibility of the parents to provide their children balanced physical, intellectual and spiritual formation. Faith Formation is an important task of the parish community as well. The service of the catechists and volunteers is greatly appreciated. Thank you all, for your support and sacrifice for this important ministry.



What virtue is the cornerstone of discipleship? Love. Jesus preached about it, lived it, and summarized his greatest commandment featuring it. Love is in our DNA. To follow Jesus, then, is to follow the path of love. While this may appear to be an attractive and easy option, it most assuredly is not. Authentic love always comes with sacrifice. It is the complete giving of oneself to another. The sacrificial character of love always requires that we leave something aside and pursue something else. This is at the heart of self-denial. Love asks us to make choices that are often difficult.

There is a reason Jesus asks that the love of God come first. "Charity is the right attitude of mind which prefers nothing to the knowledge of God. If a man possesses any strong attachment to the things of this earth, he cannot possess true charity (St. Maximus the Confessor)." "If anyone comes to me without hating his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple." A devoted disciple must be single-minded in her quest for God. She cannot allow anyone or anything to have more power over her soul than God. When any earthly attachments become more important than Love, we can get ourselves into trouble.

The Gospel calls us to walk boldly into the darkness, confusion, and emptiness of the world clothed in the mantle of love. We are asked to walk with others on their journey, offering a supportive, healing, challenging, and faithful presence. Ours is not to judge. To walk this sacrificial journey means that I must put myself aside and focus on the needs of others. "A sacrifice to be real must cost, must hurt and must empty ourselves (St. Teresa of Calcutta)." Love helps us walk straight and focus to see things more clearly and help others to do so as well. Many folks struggle to find joy and meaning in life. People may simply need someone with the freedom to sit with them in their pain, so they don't feel so alone. Through acts of kindness, gestures of acceptance, and words of compassion, burdens can be lightened. Believe in God's love and seek it above all other things! ©LPI


