



Stewardship of Time, Talent and Treasure

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The weekend we begin the stewardship process here at our Parishes. It is an important event in the life of a parish. Stewardship is a way of living. It is the acknowledging of God as the Creator and the Owner of all. Stewardship is a way of thanking God for all our blessings by returning to God a portion of the gifts- our time, talent, and treasure- that we have been given. It enhances our relationships with God and one another. Stewardship is living out a commitment to be Christ-centered rather than self-centered and involves a conversion of the heart.

Time is a very precious gift given to us by God, but yet it can not be stored up like grain in a barn. Most of us feel we don't have enough time for all the things we want to do. Everyone is given the same amount of time; 24 hours each day, 168 hours each week. Once a moment passes, it is gone forever. So, the question is: **how do we choose to use our time?** For us, stewardship of time should include setting aside periods for family prayer, for the reading of Scripture, for visits to the Blessed Sacrament, and for the active participation at Mass. Assisting individuals, organizations, and the Church is another way to share our personal time for the glory of God.

This Sunday scriptural readings teach us the need of perseverance in prayer. The first step to live the life of stewardship is staying in prayer. We are called to do our duties as stewards by nurturing the gift of faith through our prayer. As faithful stewards, we have to give enough time to pray. Family is the first place where we learn to pray and to persevere in prayer. For young children in particular, daily family prayer is the first witness of the faith in Christ. Family prayer leads to the perfect prayer of the Church which is the holy Mass. In the task of prayer there can be no rest or vacation, for Christ commands us "Pray always" (Lk 18:1). God will reward us at the right time.

Sharing our **talent** that God has given us strengthens the Church and its mission. All of us have been blessed with special talents and gifts from God. These talents and gifts are not given to us just for our own use, but are given to us for the enrichment of the lives of others in order for us to serve God better. Jesus asks of us to do his works by using our talents and blessings in our community and his Church: visit the sick and elderly, feed the hungry, teach those who want to learn, console the lonely and sorrowful, give a helping hand and a kind word.

Sharing our **treasure** is an important part of stewardship. Throughout Scripture, we are taught to give God our "first fruits" or the "choicest portion". "Honor the Lord with your wealth, with first fruits of all your produce. Then will your barns be filled with plenty, with new wine your vats will overflow." (Proverbs 3:9-10). God alone is the owner. Everything we have is the gift of God. "The earth is the Lord's and all it holds, the world and those who dwell in it" (Psalm 24:1). Everything that God has given to us is intended to serve the divine plan. "As each one has received a gift, use it to serve one another as good stewards of God' varied grace." (1Peter 4:10). Therefore, our life is to be lived in gratitude toward God.

In the coming weekends, you will hear from our fellow parishioners about the stewardship of our parish and their personal stewardship journey. Stewardship Ministry Catalog and Commitment Forms will be mailed to you soon. At the end of the four-week stewardship process, you will be asked to make a specific commitment of your time, talent and treasure to our parish. Thank you for your generosity and willingness to share God's blessings with our parish community.



Special Disaster Emergency Collection – October 15/16

Does God finally answer our persistent prayers to stop us from bothering Him? Yet, Jesus tells his disciples to "pray always without becoming weary." Maybe the type of prayer necessary to endure the trials of discipleship and the challenges and criticisms of Christian teaching goes beyond words. We need to tend to the realities of human life. The persistent prayer of which Jesus speaks is the prayer of the heart. This contemplative, silent, loving prayer gives us the vision to see God in all things, especially in each human soul. Desiring God alone and not only what we want God to do for us places this love relationship foremost in our minds, hearts, and souls. As we breathe in and exhale out, the Divine Life flows. This alone can provide the strength of endurance to confront anything contrary to the truth of faith. ©LPi


