



The First Sunday of Advent - November 26-27, 2022

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The word “Advent” comes from the Latin word *Adventus*, meaning “coming.” Not “he came” but “the coming.” It has an idea of a constancy in it and not just arrival at one time and not at another. There are three comings of Christ. The First Coming is the coming of the Savior in Bethlehem, and this is an historical coming. The Second Coming is the end of the world. The Third Coming, of course, his coming into our hearts each day. One way of really enriching our Advent journey is to keep in mind these three comings of Jesus, and how they relate to one another. Our preparation to celebrate his birth is the occasion for deepening our relationship with our Lord and to experience his presence with us.

The gospel passage (Matthew 24:37-44) says that the end will come in an unexpected time, with people eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, and working in their homes or businesses. In this routine normal life, it might be easy to forget the “coming of the Son of Man.” In the days of Noah, the people placed too much emphasis on the normal cares and necessities of life. They were too concerned with eating and drinking. Jesus reminds us that there is something more important than the worldly affairs. We must not slip into the routine of ordinary life and miss the opportunity of life itself. Jesus warns us six times in today’s gospel that we do not know what day or hour he is coming for us. Therefore, stay awake, and be prepared at all times.

How can we stay awake and be prepared at all times? The first step is **Prayer**. Each day as we rise in the morning, we ought to take a brief moment to pray, consciously invite the Lord into our hearts. During the day, from time to time, we can turn to him reminding ourselves of his constant presence in our brothers and sisters. Every night when we go to bed, give thanks to God for that day, and let us ask ourselves, “Where have I found Christ today?” Praying the rosary daily is one of the best prayers for individuals and families. Reflective reading of the Bible is an excellent way to focus our thoughts and deepen our understanding of the meaning of Advent.

Secondly, prepare to welcome Jesus into our life, especially through the reception of the Sacraments of **Reconciliation and the Eucharist**. In this Advent season, experience Christ’s mercy in the Sacrament of Confession and prepare well for His coming again. Thirdly, if you are not a weekday Mass participant, consider participating in at least one **weekday Mass** in a week during this Advent season. Advent is also a proper time to choose an hour for **Eucharistic Adoration**. Doing some **works of charity**: It might be an encouraging word, a phone call, and a note of appreciation or a little act of kindness, giving food to hungry, ministering the sick etc.

These are some of the simple ways that we prepare ourselves to be ready to meet Christ. A good life consists not so much in the kind of work we do or how “successful” we are, but how we have related with God and with people. We are so future-oriented that we frequently forget the present entirely. We spend too much time trying to protect ourselves against future misfortunes. But we need to be more spiritually awake to prepare for our eternal life. Advent is a special season of preparation of our hearts and homes through prayers, Scripture readings, reception of Sacraments and good deeds for the coming of Christ.

Rosary Intention: “For all suffering from addiction and depression.”

St. Gertrude's Prayer for the Souls in Purgatory

Eternal Father I offer you the most Precious Blood of Your Divine Son, Jesus, in union with the Masses said throughout the world today, for all the Holy Souls in Purgatory, for all sinners everywhere, for sinners in the universal Church, those in my own home and within my family. Amen.



1st Sunday of Advent

We can embrace and relish each moment of our lives as a sacred sacrament or nonchalantly and robotically attend to what life presents. We have our feet in two worlds. One is holy and sacred, and the other is profane and secular. Which one has the greater claim on us? To what do we devote most of our energy? We can easily be consumed with the particular demands and essentials of daily life: family, work, obligations, and the like, that we don't really notice anything more than what is right before us. We become masters at "doing" and neglect our need to "savor." Jesus reminds his friends that "as it was in the days of Noah, so it will be at the coming of the Son of Man. In those days before the flood, they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, up to the day Noah entered the ark. They did not know until the flood came and carried them all away." While certain things require our daily attention, we cannot become so consumed with them that we fail to see the larger picture of what is coming. For the Christian, Advent is the time to pause, reflect, and savor. It is a time to see life as a sacrament of the moment and not just an investment in secular interests, pleasures, and personal obligations. It is easy to get distracted, lazy, preoccupied, and tired. Apathy can quickly wreak havoc on the most dedicated of souls. Whatever we can do this Advent season to be more attentive, focused, alert, and watchful will serve us well. It will make us eager and well-prepared to meet our Lord when he comes. It is for certain that he will come. Who made me? What is my purpose? What will happen to me when I die? These are pivotal questions that, in life's busyness, we hardly find time to ask and answer. They define who we are, and the answers we provide serve as guideposts and anchors in the seas of our lives. Advent is the perfect time to make friends with our souls. It is a time to perk ourselves up, open our eyes, ears, and hearts and seek God's presence in the simple moments of our lives. God is with us. Ask God to grant you a deeper appreciation for His presence and the gift of attentiveness. ©LPI


