



Belief in Life After Death

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Belief in Life after death is the most powerful and motivating force all through the ages and even now in our lives. The last week, we celebrated ‘All Saint Day’ and ‘All Souls Day’ respectively. Both our first reading (2 Maccabees 7:1-2, 9-14) and Gospel (Luke 20: 27-38) for this Sunday present the Biblical view of what happens to us after we die. The readings invite us to learn the meaning of the resurrection in our lives.

Jesus explained the doctrine of the resurrection of the dead which was supported by the Pharisees but denied by the Sadducees. A group of Sadducees attempted to trap Jesus with an imaginary and an absurd question: if a person had more than one spouse on earth, who would be the one true spouse in heaven? Jesus said to them, in heaven there will neither marry nor be given in marriage because the purpose and need for marriage will no longer exist. God created marriage to help him with creation. God told Adam and Eve, ‘Be fruitful, multiply, and fill the earth.’ (Genesis 1:28). Jesus not only reaffirms his teaching on the resurrection of the dead, but he deepens our understanding of the marriage vocation as well. Marriage is an earthly vocation to discover and live the love of God through the love of the spouse. In heaven where God is all in all, man and woman will find complete fulfillment in divine Love.

By answering the question of the Sadducees, Jesus reaffirms his teaching on the resurrection of the dead. Jesus uses the opportunity to teach that the life of resurrection is an entirely new life. Belief in the resurrection is the most fundamental of all Christian beliefs; in fact, without it, Christianity makes no sort of sense at all. Jesus died on the Cross and rose from the dead to save us from our sins and to open for us the way to eternal life. St. Paul wrote in his First letter to Corinthians, “If Christ has not been raised, your faith is vain. If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are the most pitiable people of all.” (1 Cor. 15:17, 19).

In his brief answer to the Sadducees, Jesus gives us the essential facts concerning our future status. He affirms that all those who have proved themselves worthy while in this life will rise to an eternal life. In that life, we will become like angels. We will no longer be subject to decline and decay as we now are. In heaven, we have eternal life. The scriptures today encourage us to live fully in the present, while anticipating the fullness of life in the resurrection.

The hope of our resurrection and eternal life with God gives us lasting peace and joy in the midst of the boredom and tension of our day-to-day lives. The valuable thought of our own resurrection and eternal glory should inspire us to honor our bodies, keeping them holy, pure and free from evil habits. They also encourage us to respect those with whom we come in contact, rendering them loving and humble service. Let us live our life in the hope of resurrection. That will make changes in every word, thought and action of our daily life.

Rosary Intention: ‘For the election of strong, ethical people into Office.’




