



Reform Your Lives

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

During the time of Prophet Isaiah, many of Yahweh's loyal followers were in despair thinking that Yahweh had forgotten His promises. In this condition Isaiah dispels their fears and stir up hope by prophesying the coming of a Savior in definite words referring to Jesse. (Isaiah 11:1-10). He told them that the reign of peace and justice will be established by the arrival of a Savior. Bible scholars have estimated that there are 1,845 references to Christ's coming in the OT and 318 references in the NT. St. Paul instructed Jewish Christians of Rome to draw endurance and encouragement from the Old Testament Scripture.

As the last prophet to prepare the way for Emmanuel, John the Baptist began to preach repentance (Matthew 3:1-12). He referred the words of Isaiah linking the history of salvation, his mission and arrival of Jesus. He preached conversion, exposing pride, self-righteousness, and worldliness of people. The prophet told them to 'prepare the way of the Lord, and make straight his paths'. The words in today's scripture readings are intended not just for the people of that time but also for the people of all times. They were spoken for you and me.

What do these words mean for you and me right now? They mean acknowledging our sins and reform our lives. They mean approaching God for forgiveness. They mean becoming reconciled with God, others and self. They mean a renewed life in the Holy Spirit. Only knowing and acknowledging the sins is like diagnosing the disease and taking no treatment for it. Jesus wants to enter our lives. Let us respond to John's call and open our hearts to Jesus. John the Baptist urges us to do the Savior's works of justice and peace and produce good fruit as evidence of repentance.

There are sickness and weakness in us. At the same time Jesus, the great healer is waiting for us to heal and strengthen us. Healing costs us nothing and gives us everything. After healing he tells us to grow in strength and remain healthy in spiritual life. Advent is the special season for us to make the preparation by repenting of our sins, and reform our lives through prayer, penance, and sharing our blessings with others. Jesus gave us a special way to remove our sins. That way is the true repentance and Sacrament of Reconciliation. We have this opportunity every Tuesday, Wednesday and Saturday before the Mass and **Advent Reconciliation** on **December 14th**, Wednesday, 6:30 p.m. at Ascension for both parishes. All are welcome to receive God's mercy and forgiveness through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. The whole history of Salvation speaks of God who calls us to repentance so that he can forgive us and fill us with his life. Sending his own son to the earth in human form is the ultimate expression of his love in forgiveness. Let us rejoice and thank Jesus for giving us a way to erase our past sinful elements and to reform our lives.

December 8th Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Patronal Feast Day of our country. It is the **holy day of obligation**. Let us ask her intercession to be faithful disciples of her Son, as she was, and to say yes to God's will always.


STBAFF Sponsorship Program for 2022-23

2nd Sunday of Advent

At sixty years of age, Maria and Paul had a beautiful life. High school sweethearts, they had four children, five grandchildren, a successful business, good friends and a fabulous beach house. They felt very blessed. Their strong faith in God saw them through some difficult challenges. Without warning, Paul died suddenly. Maria was devastated.

Why did God do this? Why did God allow this to happen? An indescribable depth of sadness weighed heavily upon her heart. She felt betrayed by the God she thought was looking out for her. She was overwhelmed by despair. Have you ever experienced such incredible and deafening sadness? Where is God in all of the pain?

We often want God to fix things or intervene and change nature's course. When He doesn't act as we desire, it shakes our faith. We do not always understand or appreciate why things happen as they do. There is much that is beyond our control. John the Baptist prepared the way for Jesus and Jesus is the way to God. There is something more going on in life than what we can see with human eyes. We are on a sacred path, and God is with us. God is with us in our confusion, suffering, doubts, and intense sadness. Jesus announced God's vision for humanity and taught people to see God and themselves for who they are. There is a way through and beyond all hardship and suffering. God does not abandon us.

God has a clear vision for the future, both for us individually and for our world. It is a vision of harmony and gentleness where all will live as one and the “wolf shall be a guest of the lamb.” God is not indifferent. He is the God of “endurance and encouragement.” In God, we see what we may be, what may come and who we can become. When Maria opened herself to God's creative presence, she learned to trust. She began to realize that she could endure more than she had imagined. She also discovered a spark of encouragement, bringing her through the sadness to where she could be. In retrospect, Maria knew that God's reassuring presence was with her. ©LPI
