



### The Beatitudes: The Great Charter of Christianity

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

The Beatitudes are a summary of the Sermon on the Mount. The Beatitudes are called the Charter of Christianity and the Magna Carta for humanity. The eight Beatitudes in Matthew's gospel (5:1-12) can be arranged into two categories. The first reflect a longing for a deeper relationship with God: 'Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, blessed are the poor in spirit, blessed are those who mourn'. The second group reveal the transformation of our lives as fruits of that relationship: 'Blessed are the pure of heart, the meek, the merciful, the peacemakers, the persecuted'. The first group brings us into closer relationship with God which results in the transformation of our lives described in the second group.

The word beatitude literally means "happiness" or "blessedness". The beatitudes respond to the natural desire for happiness that God has placed in every heart. They teach us the final end to which God calls us, namely, entering into the joy of the Lord (Mt 25:21-23) and into his rest (Heb 4:7-11). The beatitudes, which Jesus offers us, are a sign of contradiction to the world's understanding of happiness and joy. How can one possibly find happiness in poverty, hunger, mourning, and persecution? Poverty of the spirit finds ample room for joy in possessing God as the greatest treasure. Hunger and thirst for righteousness seek nourishment and strength in God's word and Spirit. Sorrow and mourning over wasted life and sin leads to joyful freedom from the burden of guilt and spiritual oppression. God reveals to the humble of heart the true source of abundant life and happiness. Jesus promises his disciples that the joy of heaven will more than compensate for the troubles and hardships they can expect in this world.

We imagine that certain things will make us happy like good health, financial security and a long life for our loved ones. But Jesus tells us something different. Not that those things are bad, but that we will never be happy unless we can find happiness in the midst of trials. In the beatitudes Jesus lists all the misfortunes, which can befall a person: hunger, loss of loved ones, rejections, misunderstandings, false accusations and political defeat. Jesus does tell us that we will never be happy unless we can find the hand of God in the face of such trials.

The Bible is filled with heroes who lived the Beatitudes, especially, the Apostles. Paul tells us about his persecutions. In his letter to Corinthians (2 Cor 11:24-27), he wrote "Five times I received forty lashes less one; three times I was beaten with rods, I was stoned once." "Blessed are they who are persecuted," Christ says. Peter was nailed to a cross, head down.

All through the history of the Church, we find great heroes and heroines who are beatitude people: Francis of Assisi, a peacemaker and a poor in spirit; St. Theresa of Calcutta, a heroine of mercy and charity; St. John Paul II, hungering and thirsting for righteousness. These and so many other great Christian heroes and heroines are beatitude people. After listing the Beatitudes, Jesus tells us, "Rejoice and be glad for your reward will be great in heaven." Today's gospel is an invitation to ask ourselves to what extent do we qualify to be called "blessed" by Jesus.





In my parents' bedroom there were on the wall two photos of my mom and dad from their early adulthoods. The photo of my mother entranced me when I was a boy. I loved looking at it, even though I saw her in daily life. Something about that picture captured her perfectly. It was an image of the joy, wisdom, beauty, and strength that enveloped me from the start of my life. It was an icon of the woman who fed, taught, and encouraged me. I felt a deep pride that I came from such beauty.

The beatitudes of Jesus are a kind of self-portrait. But it is a strange picture. At first, the blessings of being poor, mourning, and hungering and thirsting for righteousness may seem bizarre or, worse, a religious delusion. Who wants to look like that? But if we look again, we begin to see the characteristics of Jesus' form. He becomes poor and fills it with his riches for us, he weeps and mourns for us, and fills it with his joy, he hungers and thirsts for us to be righteous, and so satisfies us. And so on. It's the way he appears on the cross.

Perhaps we should put on our bedroom room walls the words of the beatitudes next to a crucifix of the Lord Jesus. Then we can do what the beatitudes are designed for, to gaze at the joy, wisdom, beauty, and strength of the one who is our origin, and who is with us every day. And little by little, we'll start to look like him. —*Father John Muir*


