

The Epiphany of the Lord - January 7 & 8, 2023

The Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord



Dear Sisters and Brothers,

The word Epiphany means appearance or manifestation. There are really three epiphanies recognized by the Church: the manifestation of the Lord to the Magi, the baptism of the Lord, and the first public miracle in the Gospel of John, the changing of water into wine. The Eastern Catholic Churches and the Orthodox Churches celebrate all three Epiphanies together. The Western Catholic Church divides up these celebrations.

Today we focus is on the manifestation of the Lord to the Magi. We do not know a whole lot about them. The Magi are popularly referred to as wise men and kings. According to the tradition, their names were Casper, Balthazar, and Melchior. The Magi may actually have been Persian priests or Babylonian astronomers. The main thing we know is that they were not Jewish. They were pictured as representatives of different nationality, culture and races. They offered three gifts: gold, frankincense, and myrrh. All three gifts are ordinary offerings and gifts given to a king. The three gifts had a spiritual meaning: *gold* as a symbol of *kingship of Jesus*, *frankincense* as a symbol of *priesthood*, and *myrrh* as a symbol of salvation through the suffering and *death of Jesus*.

Why would rich gentiles be interested in the Jewish Messiah? That the gentiles could be part of God's plan for His people was beyond the consideration of the Jews. But the mystery, hidden for generations was now revealed: the gentiles were to be co-heirs with the Jews, members of the same body, co-partners in the promise of Jesus Christ, as St. Paul proclaims in today's second reading (Ephesians 3:2-6).

The Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord celebrates the manifestation of God in Christ and the extension of God's saving plan for all people. The first reading, from Isaiah (60:1-6), mentions non-Jews bringing gifts in homage to the God of Israel. The passage also celebrates the divine light emanating from Jerusalem. It foresees all the nations acknowledging and enjoying that light of the God of Israel and walking by it.

Today's gospel (Mt 2:1-12) teaches us how Christ enriches those who came to him. Since the Magi came with joy in their hearts to visit the Christ child, God allowed them to see wondrous things. Jesus Christ came for all people. None were to be excluded from the Grace of God that He would bring. On the Solemnity of the Epiphany, we ask the Lord to free us from pride and prejudices. We ask Jesus to allow us to be what we call ourselves, Catholics, people of a universal Church.

I want to thank all of you who sent me greeting cards and gifts this Christmas season. Even though I can't thank each of you individually, please know that I appreciate your kindness and support. I also want to thank all of my brother priests who will be saying Mass here during my absence. Please welcome them and show them the wonderful hospitality. I will be leaving on January 9th to visit my family in India, and will be returning on February 9th, please keep me in your prayers and for a safe journey. I keep you in my prayers.



Faith and Fear

When I was little, you could tell I believed in the destructive power of the monsters who lived beneath my bed because I would never let my ankles anywhere near the bottom of the mattress. (It's common knowledge that bare ankles are premium monster bait — ask any child you know).

You can often tell what a person believes by what they fear.

But here's the thing: belief isn't always enough. It's obvious that Herod believed in Christ's power because of how terrified he was by it and by the room he made in his life for the possible impact of the Messiah. In fact, if belief was the only measure of orthodoxy, you could stand most modern Christians next to Herod and he would tower above them.

Remember, there's something just as bad as disobeying God: dis-counting Him. I know I am guilty of that in a thousand small ways each day. In the person I ignore or the opinion I sneer at. In the un-kind words I let roll from my tongue. In the prayers of thanksgiving that I don't say because I am "too busy."

I believe in God, but I do not fear Him — mostly because my very modern understanding of the concept of "fear" would lump God in with those monsters beneath my bed.

But what if we understood fear in a more traditional sense — awe, reverence, and wonder? "

All kings shall pay him homage, all nations shall serve him." — Psalm 72:11

When Herod heard the news of the coming of the Messiah, it compelled him to do something. Not the right thing, mind you, but something. It moved him into action.

So, then, it should move us all.


