

## Seventh Sunday In Ordinary Time - February 18 & 19, 2023



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

With the celebration of Ash Wednesday, the Ordinary Time is halted for the seasons of Lent and Easter. Ordinary time resumes Monday following Pentecost with the 8<sup>th</sup> week. Next Sunday is the first Sunday of Lent. Just before we begin the Lenten season, this Sunday readings invite us to be holy and be perfect as the heavenly Father is. *"Be holy, for I, the Lord, your God, am holy"* (Leviticus 19: 1-2), is the basis of Jewish and Christian morality. As God's children, we are expected to be holy sharing God's holiness by expressing his love, mercy and forgiveness.

Jesus in the Sermon on the Mount rejects even the mild form of the "Law of retaliation. Instead of retaliation, Jesus urges his disciples to practice his new law of love, forgiveness and reconciliation. Jesus wants his disciples to repay evil with kindness. Jesus illustrates his new teachings by giving three examples: When someone strikes you on your right cheek, turn the other one as well. If anyone wants to go to law with you to take away your tunic let him have your cloak also. If someone asks your service for one mile, go for two miles.

The second part of today's gospel passage is the central part of the Sermon on the Mount. It tells us uniqueness of the Christian morality: "love one's enemies". It was never heard of before or after Jesus. Loving enemies is not passionate love which the Greeks called *eros*. It is not the kind of love towards family members or love of close friends which they called *philia*. But it is the purest form of love and the word used in the N T is *agape* which is often translated into English as charity. It is the good will for another's highest good. Since *agape* is not natural, practicing it is possible only with God's grace. *Agape* love is a choice more than a feeling. We choose to love, not because our enemies deserve our love, but because Jesus loves them so much that he died for them.

Jesus commands that we are to love our enemies and pray for those who persecute us to prove that we are children of a merciful heavenly Father. Jesus places those acts of love in an extraordinary context, "Be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect." (Mt 5: 48). How can we be perfect like God? Let's take a closer look at the perfection Jesus requires. It is not so much that people will look at us and exclaim, "Wow, how did he become so good?" Jesus wants us to step out of ourselves and see things from God's perspective. "He makes his sun rise on the bad and the good, and causes rain to fall on the just and unjust." We are commanded to practice a perfection which imitates the perfection of the Father in Heaven. God cares for each person he created and Jesus gave his life even for the enemies.

When Jesus tells us to "be perfect as your heavenly Father is perfect", we are asked to do good not only to lovable people, but even to enemies and unlovable. Jesus is not only to teach us to love our enemies but he himself loved and prayed for his enemies. We see that care in Jesus who forgives those responsible for humiliating and torturing him. (Lk 23:34). And we are also asked to love and to pray for our enemies. We have in the Acts of the Apostles the example of St. Stephen, the first martyr who prayed for those who were putting him to death. (Acts 7:60). We become perfect when we try to love as God loves us, and to forgive as God forgives us.

**Rosary Intention:** "Through prayer and fasting this Lent, may we come to know Jesus better."

**Ash Wednesday Services** will be on **February 22nd**


**5:00 pm at St. Bernard and 6:45pm at Ascension Lenten Fasting and Abstinence**

**Abstinence** – Catholics 14 years of age and older must abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all the Fridays of Lent. It is only on other Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, that a Catholic may substitute another form of penance instead of abstinence.

**Fasting** – Catholics between the age of 18 and 59 inclusive are required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On these days one full meal is allowed if necessary. Food may be taken at two other times, two smaller meals, in order to maintain strength according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted. Liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed, however.

Of all the things Jesus says which seem totally bat-crazy, this one might take the cake: **"But I say to you, love your enemies, and pray for those who persecute you."** An enemy is someone who desires the destruction of you, your projects, or those you care about. To love and pray for them is to want their health, strength, and flourishing. But if they thrive, they are more likely to hurt you and others. So, aren't you indirectly willing your own destruction, or that of your friends? If you doubt that this problem is embedded in this teaching, when was the last time you actually prayed honestly for the people you really hate?

How can we solve this riddle so we might actually live this command? Recall that enemy-love is the surest sign that you love someone with God's love, and not with indirect egotism. After all, if my love for my enemy ends up hurting me or my loved ones, it can't be for me. Enemy-love costs more because there are no tit-for-tats. No reciprocity — just loved poured out, and often pain in return. That's why it is so precious and rare. "What is unusual about that?" asks the Lord about love for our friends. Jesus wants us to experience the unusual love which only comes from him.


When Jesus was being killed on the cross, he was loving his executioners. In fact, he was holding them in being as they nailed him to the cross. He loved those who were spiritually piercing his Mother's heart, while they were doing it. And when he rose from the dead, he showed us that this kind of love is always worth it.
