



Be a Light of the World



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Using two images of salt and light, in today's gospel (Matthew 5:13-16), Jesus outlines the role and the mission of Christians in this world. Jesus tells us that we are the salt of the earth and the light of the world. In Jesus' time, salt was so valuable. It was used as salary for the Roman soldiers. It was called white gold. Salt was connected with special qualities.

Salt was the most effective **medicine to heal wounds** in the ancient world. It is a **preservative**. It was the most common of preservatives, especially in the days before refrigeration. It was used to keep things from spoiling. Salt **gives flavor** to food. This is the greatest and the most important quality of salt. Food without salt is tasteless and uninteresting. Christianity is to life what salt is to food. If you take away Christianity, you take the flavor out of life. Christians then, by their Gospel-centered lives, are to work as salt to heal the wounds and hurts in others' lives, to renew the world and to preserve it from social and moral decay; and to give a distinctive taste to others' lives.

Salt was also connected with **purity** because it was white and it came from the purest of all things, the sun and the sea. As a symbol of purity, salt was the common ingredient in sacrifices offered to God by Jews and pagans. As the salt of the earth, the Christian must be an example of purity, exercising absolute purity in speech, in conduct, and even in thought.

Jesus said of himself, "I am the **light of the world**." And then he tells us, "You are the light of the world." We are, therefore, called to be and to do what Jesus did for the world. The Gospel urges us to shine out through our words and actions. A light is first and foremost something which is meant **to be seen**. Jesus speaks of a city built on top of a hill; there is no way to hide it. And he speaks of a lamp on a lamp stand. What is the point in lighting a lamp and then covering it up? What is the point in getting baptized, joining the Christian community and then becoming completely invisible to others?

A light is a guide. We know how difficult when there is no light on the streets or in our house. A light is something to make clear the way. So then, a Christian must make the way clear to others. The world needs its guiding lights. A light can often be a **warning light**. We watch green, yellow and red lights in the traffic. It is sometimes the Christian's duty to bring to his fellowmen a necessary warning. If our warnings are given, not in anger, not in irritation, not in criticism, not in condemnation, but in love, they will be effective.

The Christian's task is to be the salt of society, preserving, healing, adding flavor, giving meaning where there is no meaning and giving hope where there is no hope. Every Christian needs to reflect the light received from Christ and radiate that light in the form of love, kindness, mercy, forgiveness and humble service.


