





Pentecost Sunday – May 27 & 28, 2023

“Lord, Send out Your Spirit..”



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Pentecost was originally a Jewish festival called “Shavuot” celebrated on the fiftieth day after Passover. It is also the ‘Festival of Weeks’, which commemorates the giving of the Torah at Mount Sinai fifty days after the exodus from Egypt. The word Pentecost comes from the Greek for “pentekoste” meaning “fiftieth.” For Christians, it is a memorial of the day the Holy Spirit descended on the apostles and the Blessed Virgin Mary, in the form of fiery tongues, an event that took place fifty days after the resurrection of Jesus. The feast also commemorates the official inauguration of the Church by the apostolic preaching of St. Peter, resulting in the conversion of 3,000 Jews to the Christian faith. Pentecost is, thus, the official birthday of the Church.

On the day of Pentecost, Jesus fulfilled his promise to send the Advocate or Paraclete. The gift of the Spirit would also enable them to fulfill Jesus’ commission to preach the gospel to all nations. Today’s gospel passage also tells us how Jesus gave to the Apostles the power and authority to forgive sins. “Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained.” (Jn 20: 23). These wonderful words, which bind together inseparably the presence of the Holy Spirit and the gift of forgiveness, are referred to directly in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

The Acts of the Apostles describes how the Holy Spirit empowered the early Christians to bear witness to Christ by their sharing love and strong faith. This “anointing by the Holy Spirit” also strengthened the early Christian martyrs during the period of brutal persecution that followed. Today’s Scripture readings remind us that the gift of the Holy Spirit moves its recipients to action and inspires them to share this gift with others.

How beautiful is the thought that the Holy Spirit lives within us! St. Paul reminds the Corinthian community of this fact when he asks, “Do you not know that you are God’s temple and that God’s Spirit dwells in you?” (1 Cor 3:16). It is the Holy Spirit who develops our intimacy with God. “God has sent the Spirit of His Son into our hearts crying, ‘Abba’(Father).” (Gal. 4:6). “God’s love has been poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit who has been given to us.” (Rom 5:5). “No one can say, ‘Jesus is Lord,’ except by the Holy Spirit.” (1 Cor 12:3). Moreover, we know that it is the Holy Spirit who teaches us to pray (Rom. 8:26). By the power of the Spirit, we also know the Lord Jesus through his Church. It is the Holy Spirit who enlivens, enlightens, guides, and sanctifies the Church.

We know Jesus through the Sacramental Mysteries of the Church, and the Holy Spirit is at the heart of the sacramental life of the Church. Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Orders are the Sacramental Mysteries through which people receive the seal of the Holy Spirit. It would be impossible for us to receive Jesus in the Eucharist without the descent of the Holy Spirit at the Epiclesis of the Divine Liturgy. Even the forgiveness of sins, comes through the Holy Spirit (Jn 20:21-23). The Holy Spirit both confirmed the apostles in Holy Orders as priests and empowered them to forgive sins by His power, a work which He continues today in each of our priests. May the Holy Spirit rekindle in us the spirit of new life and the fire of God’s love, and renew the face of the earth.

Ordination: Good news is that four Seminarians were ordained to the priesthood on this Pentecost weekend (May 27th) at the Cathedral of St. Paul. Please keep them in your prayers.

Widows of Joy - Full Day Retreat "Hope & Healing" - Free Event – June 3, 2023



May 28, 2023 Pentecost Sunday

I hope you'll acknowledge with me a simple fact: it's not normal to have tongues of fire "part and come to rest" on people. It is actually pretty strange. Yet that is precisely what we celebrate in this feast of Pentecost. How can this mean something to us in our daily lives?

Jews had a tradition that heaven is a temple made of bricks of fire. So, through the apostles, the heavenly temple is coming to earth. But this fire looks like tongues, not bricks. That means that heavenly speech will be crucial to building a dwelling place for God on earth among men and women. So, it's no surprise when the apostles begin to speak in a miraculous way that is understood by all language groups. They are speaking of what God has done in and through Jesus: bringing heaven to earth and uniting all peoples to God and to each other. How often our speech divides: gossip, slander, insults, and so on. How strange and rare it is when people speak in ways that truly unite instead of divide. Imagine how powerful it would be if you and I began to speak at home, at work, and in our community in a way that made people hear heavenly speech. Imagine if you spoke of the mighty deeds of God in a way that everyone could understand. That's precisely what the Holy Spirit descends upon us to do. Ask Him to come as a tongue of fire to you once again, and He will. Then speak! — Father John Muir


