
Wondering what you can do to help?

Information for Small Group Leader Formation Series at St. Bernards and Ascension

lune 20, 2023

- 1. Thank you for considering the invitation to participate in the Small Group Leader Formation Series at our parish.
- 2. The 7 sessions will be held at the following times:
 - Session 1: September 21st, 6:30pm at St. Bernard
 - Session 2: September 28th, 6:30pm at St. Bernard Ascension
 - o Session 3: October 5th, 6:30pm at St. Bernard
 - o Session 4: October 12th, 6:30pm at St. Bernard
 - o Session 5: October 26th, 6:30pm at Ascension
 - o Session 6: November 9th, 6:30pm at Ascension
 - Session 7: November 16th, 6:30pm at Ascension
- 3. Each session will last less than two hours, and will include times of prayer, teaching, and small group sharing.
- 4. Because this series is a formation toward leading small groups, and small group sharing is an important component of it, participants are expected to attend most, if not all sessions, in person. Recognizing that life happens, there will be an ability to "make up" missed sessions, but non-live participation is intended to be the exception, not the rule. If you know that you will need to miss more than two sessions, there will be future offerings of the training.
- 5. Participation in the series does not commit you to lead a small group. Upon the formation's conclusion, there will be a mutual discernment, that will include the pastor, on whether each participant will lead a small group starting in Winter 2024 and what type of small group s/he might feel comfortable leading.
- 6. Furthermore, the formation will help discern other supporting leadership roles within the small group, such as hospitality or music ministry, as possible alternatives to being "the leader."
- 7. We expect that different types of small groups will emerge. Examples include (but are not limited to): small groups among family, friends and neighbors as well as parish/pastoral groups among youth, marriage prep, RCIA, young adults, widows, etc.).
