





40 HOURS DEVOTION

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

We are currently in a 3-year **Eucharistic Revival** called for by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. The National Eucharistic Revival is a movement to revitalize and foster Eucharistic devotion, helping to deepen understanding of the Real Presence and to renew our worship of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. National Eucharistic Pilgrimage will be held from May 17 - July 16, 2024. Just as crowds followed Christ throughout his earthly ministry, our nation will process with our Eucharistic Lord over 6,500 miles, through cities, along highways, and past rural towns, on his way to the 10th **National Eucharistic Congress** in Indianapolis, Indiana from June 17-21, 2024. This year is about fostering Eucharistic devotion at the parish level, strengthening our liturgical life through the faithful celebration of the Mass and Eucharistic adoration.



We, the Parish family of Ascension and St. Bernard, are planning 40 Hours Devotion of our Lord in the Eucharist at St. Bernard church beginning with 8.00 pm Mass on Thursday, May 30, and ending with 5.00pm Mass on Saturday, June 1st, on the eve of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ.

Forty Hours' Devotion is a special exposition of the Blessed Sacrament over a period of three days, during which prayers continues uninterrupted for an approximate total of 40 hours. Eucharistic adoration holds a prominent place for Catholics. This is a vital part of the Catholic liturgical life. Eucharist Adoration should be a part of the liturgical life of every Catholic. 40 Hours' Devotion provides a wonderful opportunity for the spiritual growth of each person, family and the parish as a whole. In a world where temptation and evil abound, where devotion to the Mass and our Lord in the Holy Eucharist have declined, where the practice of penance and confession have been forgotten, we need the Forty Hours Devotion more than ever.

Forty Hours' Devotion is a great opportunity to gather as a family before the Blessed Sacrament and to pray before the Lord in solemn adoration. It gives us an opportunity to deepen our appreciation of the importance of the Eucharist in our lives. We rest with Jesus, spending time with him, and we are individually consoled and nourished. From him we receive the grace and strength to bring about renewal in our families, our workplaces, our parishes and our world. Saint Alphonsus Liguori wrote, "Of all devotions, that of adoring Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament the greatest after the sacrament, the one dearest to God and the one most helpful"

We need a minimum of one adorer per hour before our Lord in the Eucharist and for overnight hours, we prefer two or three adorers.

What is going on in our Parishes and in the Community

Next weekend we will be having a **Second Collection** to support the **Catholic Home Mission Appeal**. This appeal assists our brothers and sisters here in the United States who do not have access to basic pastoral services like Mass, the sacraments, and religious education. 40 HOURS DEVOTION

Why 40 hours? Scripture gives us repeated symbolic instances of the number. The rains during the time of Noah lasted 40 days and nights. Moses lived 40 years in Egypt. The Israelites wandered forty years in the desert. Jesus fasted and prayed for 40 days in the desert before beginning his public ministry. We spend 40 days in prayer, fasting and almsgiving during Lent. Most importantly, from the crucifixion on the afternoon of Good Friday to the Resurrection on Easter morning, Jesus lay in the tomb for roughly 40 hours. Probably the first inspiration for this 40 Hours devotion came from the traditional “forty-hour period” from our Lord’s burial until the resurrection.

History: The exact origin of the Forty Hours Devotion is not completely known. The practice of Forty Hours Devotion originated in Milan about the year 1530. On the whole the evidence seems to favour the conclusion that a Capuchin Father, Joseph Piantanida da Fermo, was the first to organise the arrangement by which the Forty Hours’ Exposition was transferred from church to church in Milan. It flourished under the promotion of saints like St. Charles Borromeo, St. Anthony Maria Zaccaria, St. Ignatius of Loyola, St. Francis de Sales, St. Philip Neri, and many others. Recognizing the tremendous graces offered through this devotion as well as the dangers threatening the Church, Pope Clement VIII in his letter “*Graves et diurnae*” in 1592 issued directives for the official observance this devotion in the diocese of Rome.

In our own country, St. John Neumann, the fourth bishop of Philadelphia, introduced first, the Forty Hours Devotion. The first was held in St. Philip Neri Parish in 1853. At the Plenary Council of Baltimore in 1866, the Forty Hours Devotion was approved for all Dioceses of the United States.



Recently I was with my little dog Libby at a retreat center in the Arizona desert. I sat in a chair near a ravine filled with shrubs. Unbeknownst to me, Libby wandered down there and disappeared. Suddenly an animal's wild shriek erupted from the area. Without thinking, I bolted down into the ravine fully expecting to see coyotes, javelinas, or rattlesnakes. I didn't care. I desperately wanted to get Libby out of there, without any self-regard. Before I could face whatever danger lay hidden, my dog blissfully trotted out from an entirely different area, utterly unaware that I had (quite heroically) just placed my life on the line.

When the adrenaline wore off, I thought to myself: how far would I have been willing to go to save her? I don't know. But I do know, if I had literally died, my friends and family would have certainly thought me insane for dying for a dog. No offense, Libby.

How passionately Jesus wants us to know him and his willingness to die for us! This week he says, "**I know my own and my own know me,**" and "**I lay down my life for the sheep.**" Here we encounter an insanely excessive love for us. Christianity is a relationship and not simply a religion or ethical code. In Jesus, God rescues and saves us. He laid down his life for you and me — and he has taken it up again. So often we are like Libby — blissfully ignorant of the reality of both our spiritual danger and his saving love. This Easter season, the risen Jesus calls us to be more conscious than ever before about his love. He never ceases to lay down his life for us. — Father John Muir
