





The Most Holy Body And Blood Of Christ – June 1 & 2, 2024

The Feast of Corpus Christi

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Every year, we celebrate the Solemnity of *Corpus Christi*. Although we celebrate the institution of the Holy Eucharist on Holy Thursday, the Church wants to emphasize its importance by a special feast. It was Pope Urban IV who extended the feast to the universal Church.

Our belief in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist derives from the promise of Christ to give his Body and Blood as our spiritual food and drink. It is found in the Gospels. Eucharistic theologians explain the real presence by a process called transubstantiation: the entire “substance” of bread and wine is changed into the glorified Body and Blood of Christ, retaining only the accidents, “taste, color, shape etc.” of bread and wine. Vatican II states as a sacrifice, “the holy Eucharist is the center and culmination of Christian life.”

The bread and wine are transformed, so that we can be transformed into sons and daughters of God. All Christians who gather throughout the whole world, is properly referred to as the Body of Christ. As St. Paul tells us, we are the body of Christ, and each of us is a part of it (1 Cor. 12:27). Through this Solemnity we renew our commitment to this transformation, we renew our commitment to the Lord, really and truly present in the most holy sacrament of the Eucharist. And may we, like Jesus, become life for the world.

The celebration of the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ is an opportunity for us to focus on the Mass and the Eucharist. The act of receiving Holy Communion is meant to foster the abiding presence of the Lord in our soul and in our heart. The Eucharist is the Lord’s dying gift to us. We receive His Body, His Blood, His humanity and Divinity. We celebrate the Living Memory of Jesus Christ. We speak to Him within ourselves. And He speaks to us, calling us to unite our pains to His Cross, strengthening us with the Living Food for the Journey of our Lives. The Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ invites us to renew and deepen our faith in the Eucharist. When our faith in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist is strong, then our desire to participate Mass and to receive Communion often is strong.

It is very appropriate to conclude the **40 Hours of Adoration** in our parish on the feast of Corpus Christi. Eucharistic devotions are meant to deepen our love for Christ really and truly present in the Eucharist. A deeper love for Christ in the Eucharist always leads to a deeper love for our family, neighbor and for parish. I express my **gratitude to all** who signed up and participated in the 40 hours of Adoration. I am also grateful to all who work hard and prayed for the success of this great devotion. May the Holy Communion and Eucharistic adoration strengthen our unity, mutual love, and spiritual and physical health.

Rosary Intention: “For the grace to renew and deepen our faith in the Holy Eucharist.”





The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

The best way to understand the Eucharist is to recall God's long, careful teaching process beginning in the Old Testament. This week in Exodus 24, we learn the basic pattern. Moses reads the dictates of God's law to the people, who profess their allegiance to it. Then Moses takes representatives of Israel's twelve tribes and splashes the sacrificed blood of animals in two directions: on the altar and on the people. It's clear and serious business: clear, because the participants are entering a blood-bond with God Himself; serious, because the dead animals symbolize the life-and-death stakes at play.

Many centuries later, God uses the experience at Sinai to teach us something new. At the Last Supper, like a new Moses, Jesus proposes to "pour out" blood as a new covenant. It will land on the altar of the cross and the lips of his disciples. They have promised to be obedient to him who is God's law in flesh. This renews and elevates the breath-taking romance God wants with His people, unfolding from Sinai to this Supper. The Body and Blood of Christ is the sacrificial action whereby this covenant is strengthened.

How hopeful that, like us, the Israelites and the apostles repeatedly fail to live up to their promises and discover that the blood of the covenant continually renews and refreshes them. Today the blood of Christ faithfully flows, to unite and renew, moving us forward toward where our great teacher is taking us. This week, we should say a renewed "amen" to God who so carefully teaches us how to be one with Him in this new covenant. —Father John Muir
