



The Ascension of the Lord – May 11 & 12, 2024



Dear Sisters and Brothers,

'What should I do during Eucharistic Adoration?'

Happy Feast of Ascension of the Lord to all, especially to the Ascension parish family. Most people have asked or at least wondered that '**what should I do during Eucharistic Adoration?**' There are no specific rules about what you should do during Eucharistic Adoration. Just "be there" in Jesus' presence. Adoring Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament takes no special skill, just a willingness to spend time with the Lord. Jesus is there waiting to listen to you, go and talk to him as a friend.

However, these are some suggestions what to do during private Eucharistic adoration. There are four types of prayer most appropriate in the presence of the Eucharist, namely, **adoration and praise**, **confession** (repentance), **thanksgiving**, and **supplication** (petition and intercession). The names of these four types of prayer can be remembered through the acronym "ACTS."

1. Prayer of Adoration and praise. A prayer of adoration is a prayer that praises God's goodness and majesty. We praise God for who He is and for what He has given us: giving us life, for the wonder and beauty of our world, and for all the many blessings we enjoy. Pray the prayer that St Francis of Assisi instructed his brothers to pray whenever they were before the Blessed Sacrament: "*I adore you, O Christ, present here and in all the churches of the world, for by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.*"

2. A prayer of confession is a prayer of repentance. Acknowledge your sins against God and others, and asking for forgiveness. Think of those who have hurt you and request a special blessing for them. Ask God to forgive you for all the times you have acted against God's will, and neglected or hurt someone else.

3. A prayer of thanksgiving helps us to be grateful for God's many blessings, spiritual and temporal, and helps us to recognize and appreciate all the good things God gives to us. Reserve some time to thank God for his blessings and gifts: the gifts of life, health, families and friends, the gift of food, clothing, and shelter, the gift of faith, and the numerous other gifts we often take for granted.

4. A prayer of supplication is a prayer of requests before God. This is probably the most familiar form of prayer for us. Supplications are often divided into petitions and intercessions. In the prayer of **petitions**, the request we make for ourselves, for our needs and the needs of others. Bring before the Blessed Sacrament all those who have asked you to pray for them. Ask the Lord to address their concerns. In the prayer of **intercessions**, the requests we make on behalf of others. This form of prayer can be a source of blessing upon others, the Church, and our world. Because we know that Our Lady and the Saints intercede for us before God.





May 12, 2024
7th Sunday of Easter

A few months ago, I had the singular privilege of a private meeting with Pope Francis. We were a small group of pastors, composed largely of non-Catholics. The Holy Father wished to discuss our work for Christian unity. The phrase I remember him saying with greatest frequency was: *Tutti dentro*. It means, “Everyone in.” He clearly wanted us to emphasize that the Church is made for the whole human race, not a select few. At the center of his concern was unity. We are all brothers and sisters, he said multiple times. The Church’s primary longing is for everyone to join Her.

This longing is at the heart of this Ascension feast day. We hear the longest recorded prayer of the one whom Pope Francis represents. Jesus’ concern is unity, praying to the Father, “**that they may be one, even as we are one**” (John 17:11). The deep unity of all people in Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit is what Jesus most desires. It is what he ascends to accomplish.

Do we have this same burning desire in our hearts, too? Or do we see Christian unity as an unrealizable dream? Or worse, as something that threatens our own narrow tribal interests? This feast is a wonderful time to consider our attitude toward Christian unity, and to commit to do whatever we can to foster it. It is the Pope’s desire because it is that of Jesus — and it should be ours, too. — *Father John Muir*
